Cave City, Ky., Feb. 10.—(By Associated Press)—William H. Miller, reporter for the Louisville Courier-Journal, was the first witness summoned before the military court of inquiry today.

"Skeels" Miller was one of the leading rescuers and made repeated trips into Sand cave in the effort to free Floyd Collins before the cave passage way was blocked by slides and a rising of the floor.

The court adjourned shortly after noon till 3 p. m., after hearing two witnesses. More testimony was in prospect when the session was to be resumed.

"There are," said Miller, "no other men in there who answers to the name of Floyd Collins."

Senator McNary, republican, Oregon challenged the statement of the witness that the Oregon Growers association was an example of successful co-operative marketing.

He asserted he was one of the largest prune growers in the west and head of one of the biggest co-operative organizations, and "as a matter of fact, the Oregon Growers' association now is on the rocks" because they tried to spread out too far.

Senator Harrison, democrat, Mississippi, questioned the witness on the source of the information that led to such drastic recommendations for the revision of the protective tariff.

HOUSE VOTE RETENTION OF COUNTY JUDGE (Continued from Page One) by the abolition of county judges, brought forth the main tilt.

Representative Pierce moved that it be indefinitely postponed, but it was laid on the table for action later. It is probable that effort will be made to obtain a reconsideration of house bill 252 within the three day period allowed.

"The measure is most meritorious and important," declared Representative Graham.

House bills passed during the morning session included: 251 providing for the assembling of the council of judges and the reimbursement of them; 304 providing that fair associations in counties where county fairs have not been official; 342 raising the 25 cent fee to 50 cents for the recording of certain sales by county clerks; 347 empowering the state forester to order supervision of logging activities at dangerous periods in timber adjacent to state forests; 349 relating to the filing of index liens upon chattels; 367 providing for the combining of cooperative associations.
