

ILL FATED BOAT FOUND IN RIVER BODY MISSING

The ill-fated motor boat in which Charles Purcell lost his life in the Willamette river on the night of January 31, was discovered last evening by Walter Gerth, proprietor of the West Salem store, who rescued P. L. Turnidge, Purcell's companion, from drowning on the night of the accident.

While Gerth has been assisting the relatives of Turnidge and Purcell in their search, he had little hopes until the water began to abate appreciably. Yesterday he started out in dead earnest going down one side of the river in his launch as far as Lincoln and then doubling back. Coming up on this side, he got to a point about 50 yards below where the accident happened on the west side of McIntosh island but the east side of the main channel and he discovered the launch lying on its side. The water has gone down so that a bare tip of one side of the motorboat was visible above water. It was near dark when the discovery was made.

It was thought possible Purcell may be under the boat, that he seized the boat when the accident occurred and went down with it.

being dragged along. But when the boat was pulled out this morning, the body of Purcell was not found and it is probably somewhere in the river.

Gerth, who discovered the boat and rescued Purcell, is given credit by the officers for being one of the most expert of rivermen and being responsible for locating the huddle from a major number of the tragedies happening on the river. He is thoroughly acquainted with the stream and its eccentricities.

WORLD FAIR IN BRUSSELS

Brussels.—A world's fair is to take place in Belgium in 1930, in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the founding of the kingdom. NEW OCEAN CABLE PLANNED BY BRITISH

London.—Because of the heavy press of business on the Pacific cable, occupying it to the limit of its capacity, the Pacific Cable Board has decided to call for tenders in the near future for duplicate cables which will be in use inside the next 18 months. This statement was made by the chairman of the board to a deputation from the Empire Press Union, which asked for a reduction in rates for press messages to Australia and New Zealand, and that facilities for this traffic should be substantially improved.
