

COMMITTEES TO AID BOARD IN RESEEDING LOANS

A committee of five persons in each county where state funds are to be loaned...

Blank applications for loans, printed forms of notes and crop mortgages, waivers of liens, etc., will be furnished...

Where the land to be re-seeded is held under lease or contract of purchase, the certificate forming a part of the application must be signed by the lessor or vendor.

The certificates of committee recommending loan must be signed by at least one of the members...

Each application for a loan must be accompanied by the certificate of a responsible abstractor or attorney at law.

Holders of prior liens upon the crops to be re-seeded to the state must execute proper waivers thereof...

Proper waivers must be executed by holders of mortgages, judgments or other incumbrances upon the land proposed to be re-seeded.

Upon the approval of a loan by the board of control the state treasurer will promptly remit the amount thereof to a bank in the county to be designated by the committee...

Upon the delivery of any mortgaged crop into the warehouse, the wheat receipts therefor shall be issued by the warehouseman in the name of the Oregon state board of control...

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Shaft Dug to Save Cave-Imprisoned Man

mouth of Sand cave. In the original exploration of the diamond drill, a few feet distant from the shaft a soft spot was indicated at 51 feet, and another such soft spot was shown last night, followed by at least 10 feet of limestone.

The engineering staff made immediate preparations to timber around and down into the new tunnel and flush the sixteenth section of shaft timbering only sufficiently to prevent serious cave-ins on the wall opposite the new tunnel.

Carmichael explored the mouth of the new tunnel at daybreak and said he hoped they would have Collins by noon.

The new tunnel as the mouth of it was further cleared away, was easily large enough to accommodate a good sized man, and as far as they could peer down into it, ran straight away from the north-west corner of the shaft, diagonal to the left toward the mouth of Sand cave.

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TUNNEL DISCOVERED IN RESCUE SHAFT INTO SAND CAVE

discovered on the left or north-west side of the Sand cave rescue shaft early today. Timbering was rushed on the fifteenth section and preparations made to drive piling into the side wall, around and above the tunnel hole, so a rescue party could enter it with safety.

The hole was unmistakably a passageway leading down into a limestone cave and miners brought up pieces of cavernous rock to exhibit to H. T. Carmichael. The medical staff and other officials were hurriedly awakened.

While the miners felt that it might be several hours before a rescue party would be permitted to explore the tunnel, there was already keen competition among the diggers for the honor of going down on the next shift. The down draft in the shaft was so strong that the miners' lamps were blown out when they looked down the new tunnel.

Hole Discovered

The hole was first discovered about 1:30 a. m., and Carmichael, in charge of the shaft and a doctor were awakened. Meanwhile, the diggers had uncovered a hole which seemed two or three feet high extending downward at a

rather sharp slope. Their lamps were blown out by the downdraft, when they looked down the hole. The bottom of the shaft was hurriedly cleared for the sixteenth section of timbering so short plies could be driven in the side wall parallel to the new tunnel.

The discovery of the new tunnel was closely guarded, the miners refusing to talk about it. But looking down the mouth of the shaft, the shadow of the hole was clearly evident. The downdraft had cleared out the shaft of the thin fog which has filled the shaft since the cold snap, caused by the miners breathing and the warmth of their bodies and the hole in the flickering light of the miners' lamps, appeared to extend nearly half way across one side of the six foot square shaft.
