

WHAT IS DOING IN LEGISLATIVE SESSION

REENACTMENT OF INCOME TAX BILL TO BE SUGGESTED

Reenactment of the state income tax law would be brought about if a house bill to be introduced by the house committee on assessment and taxation were passed. However, the bill stipulates that the law would apply only to the year 1923 Representative North of the committee on assessment and taxation explained that a great deal of difference of legal opinion exists on the step necessary to collect unpaid 1923 income tax. "One bill has been passed," he explained. "But there are many who feel it will not suffice and that reenactment of the income tax law with provision that it apply only to 1923 is the only legal way of obtaining the back tax."

A substitute Americanization bill for house bills 275 and 294 has been prepared by Representatives Woodward and Kirkwood for introduction this afternoon. The bill embodies most of the ideas incorporated in the other two bills. It would establish a department of Americanization to be conducted under the supervision of the state superintendent of public instruction. A commission of five unpaid persons would be established. Its purpose would be to lay out a course of study and promote the work of Americanization throughout the state in conjunction with the public school system. The commission would be authorized to appoint a state director to assist the superintendent of public instruction. An appropriation of \$10,000 is called for in the bill.

\$1000 RAISED FOR WAR MOTHERS STATUE

A packed house at the Crystal Palace dance hall Saturday night and a record of hundreds of dance tickets sold that were not used combined to show the support given the American Legion in its effort to pay off part of the debt contracted by the erection of the memorial to gold star mothers and the sons that gave their lives in the World War, near the court house at Salem, erected by the Salem War Mothers.

More than \$1000 was cleared over expenses of the dance, made light by various donations of work and material by Salem business men. All funds will be turned over to the War Mothers association for payment on the remaining debt on the memorial statue.

For final action is lying out as it becomes more and more evident that come what may there is no hope of breaking up the senate combination that is standing with the governor on such measures as the fish, game, bonus and other bills and that the vetoes would still stand if the legislature remained in session for six months.

Big Stuff All Bank

Gradually were developing upon the more or less independent members the conviction that all of the so-called "big stuff" of the session is principally political bunk, and they are anxious to get down to the real business, the appropriation bills, and then go home. What happens to the other proposals now does not interest those who would have to be interested to break the deadlock that exists.

Today it can be said advisedly that the anti-Person program which the legislative organizations launched themselves during the first few days has fallen flat.

But there will be no dearth of activity during the remainder of the week. Every member has some one bill or another in which he is interested enough to try to get action upon it, and in the aggregate they will give both houses plenty to do.

375 Bills Await Action

This morning there were practically 375 bills in the hoppers of the two houses awaiting attention, and this number includes practically all of the big controversial measures in one house or the other. Such bills as the fish commission bill, the fish code, the game commission bill, bills dealing with the personnel of the bonus commission, a bill to abolish the market agent's office

still had to go through at least one house, and the highly debatable subject of what is to be done with the state prohibition department had not come up in either of the houses.

Six hundred and ninety-five bills had been introduced in the two houses up to Saturday, 469 in the house and 226 in the senate. There are more to come, and among those yet to appear are the appropriation measures that will come out of the ways and means committee along about Wednesday or Thursday. In the house 161 bills have been passed, and 71 have been withdrawn or defeated, leaving 204 on the calendar. The senate still has a few more than 100 of its own bills to consider. Also it must be remembered that both houses also have to pass upon all of the measures passed over from the other.

Busy Days Ahead

Unless stringent closure rules are adopted neither house will be more than half way through its program by Saturday night, and perhaps it would be the best thing for the state if the appropriation measures were brought in and passed and the rest left to rot where they lie.

Night sessions will be the rule of the week, that much is assured. Today the house has 71 bills on its calendar for final passage, to say nothing of the special order of business at 2 o'clock this afternoon, when the representatives will attempt to thresh out the prohibition situation. Midnight tonight will probably see the lower house still burning the electricity. In the senate the members are not so ambitious, they having only 18 bills on the day's calendar, but they too have a special order of business, ratification of the federal child labor amendment, to wrestle with.

House bill 158, is also in the senate calendar for today, and that means an oratorical war. The bill would take the appointment of the members of the state game commission out of the hands of the governor and vest it in the board of control. To explain further is a waste of words and valuable space.

Advisedly it can be said this is going to be one grand week for the galleries, and the net result will probably be a lot of unimportant bills to clutter up the statute books.

BILL DRAWN TO MAKE TREASURERS TAX COLLECTORS

The duties of tax collecting would be transferred from the hands of the sheriffs of the state to county treasurers under a house bill which is scheduled for introduction by Representative Cowgill, Jackson county. The bill points out that the duty of sheriffs has been made much heavier by the prohibition laws and that other duties are continually being imposed upon them, also that the sheriffs desire the transfer.

Salary of the state engineer would be raised from \$3600 to \$5000 a year under a house bill prepared by the irrigation committee and slated for introduction today. Actual necessary traveling expense while away from his office would also be provided.

A bill designed to reach the Pacific Spruce corporation, according to one of its authors, has been drawn up for presentation by Representative Fuller and Senator Beals. It provides for assessment for taxation of lumber and timber products from timber not taxed. Representative Fuller explained that the vast holdings of the Pacific Spruce corporation were obtained with a tax exempt provision.

question then is what is the legislature going to do about it? In the answer to that question lies the probability that the session will continue over the regular time for adjournment.

Two or three members of the ways and means committee and one or two legislators who are not members of the committee fell together casually at a dinner table last night, and it was deemed wise that some time today they find out from the attorney general whether the legislature has authority to go ahead of the state tax commission and levy a tax of about one mill in addition to the levy made by the commission in December.

This would bring the total up to about 2.9 mills—near the mark where it has been each year for the last six or seven years—and would produce approximately \$1,000,000 above what the December levy alone will produce. Members of the ways and means committee are reluctant to take this step, but they say it will likely be done if necessary as a last resort.

Then there is the possibility of a bill for a tax on gross earnings of corporations, and another for a tax on gross earnings of corporations, and another to increase the insurance and corporation fees. No one of these will be accepted by the legislature with a week's work wrapped up in out a hard opposing fight. There are any one of them.

The committee has already agreed on a bill to annex to the general fund of the state from 10 to 15 per cent of the receipts of the state activities that do not at the

present time contribute to the general fund. That also may arouse controversy.

The first day of the normal final week of the session isn't propitious from the point of view of adjournment. The house has a tremendous long calendar today, that it is said will necessitate a night session, and this includes prohibiting legislation, based on the investigating committee's report which is a special order bill which will have on final passage the Banks municipal license bill which took much time in the senate. The Dennis anti-income tax and anti-inheritance resolution is up in the house today. In the upper house today the child labor amendment is a special order bill in this afternoon, and on the calendar is the game commission bill, which provides that appointment of the commission be taken from the governor and placed with the state board of control.

The Mills post-primary convention bill is in the senate, and awaiting the fate of that bill is the fish commission bill. The fish code measure over which the house wrangled for parts of two days is yet to be acted on in the senate. The house still has the fish commission bill to pass on. This is the measure taking appointment of that commission from the governor and giving it to the board of control.

There are irrigation bills, highway bills, education bills and half a dozen others that will operate to delay adjournment.
