

INSTALL MILL MACHINERY AT SANTIAM MINE

Dallas, Or., Feb. 20.—The Lutz-Larsen Mining company, which is developing copper holdings on the Little North Fork of the Santiam river, has secured sufficient funds from stock sales to install mill machinery to handle the ore at the mine, according to announcement made here Wednesday by H. H. Lutz, mining engineer, and F. H. Kunkle, sales manager. They expect to have the machinery installed by the middle of April. There are about 20 stockholders of the company in Dallas.

FRANCE SEEKING AMERICAN LOANS

Paris, Feb. 20.—(By Associated Press)—Promise of a \$100,000,000 loan for the improvement of French finances and another \$25,000,000 for the devastated regions, to be floated in the United States as soon as the budget is definitely balanced and voted, was one of the remedies for France's troubled financial and economic situation advanced by finance Minister Clementel in an address before the chamber of deputies today.
