

SENATE BALKS AT MORE PAY FOR AIDE TO PIERCE

What some of the more conservative members of the senate have called the "high tide of salary increases," turned suddenly in the other direction with the result that the senate killed a bill which would have increased the salaries of four state officials. These were the deputy secretary of state, deputy state treasurer, secretary to the governor and state tax commissioner, whose salaries the bill proposed to increase from \$3000 to \$3600 each.

Sensors Staples, Taylor and LaFollett spoke against the bill and Senator Upton wanted the secretary to the governor to be left out of the measure, declaring that a salary of \$3000 was enough for an official whose only duty was to shake hands with the public and otherwise act as the governor's official greeter.

Before this bill was killed, however, the measure providing an increase from \$3000 to \$4000 in the salary of the state dairy and food commissioner, which was beaten Tuesday, was reconsidered and passed.

The vote on the bill to increase the salaries of the four officials named above was:

FISH CODE BILL AGAIN DELAYED

House bill 405, the fishing code bill, is having a hard time to get through the senate notwithstanding only a few votes are registered against it.

The bill was recommitted to the fisheries committee Monday after it had come up for final passage, the recommitment being to allow Senator Eddy to satisfy himself about the provisions relative to the Umpqua river, and Senator Kinney to be heard relative to the alien clause applying to the mouth of the Columbia river.

Yesterday the bill came up for

final passage again in amended form and was passed but later recalled. The amendment relative to aliens allows only two instead of five years in which an alien may complete his citizenship after applying for a license. This amendment was made in conference Tuesday.

In committee of the whole yesterday, Mrs. Kinney attempted to get the size of crabs reduced from 7 to 6 1/2 inches from tip to tip, but this failed. Senator Hall got an amendment whereby Coos county is exempt from the fee provision because crabs are not handled there commercially.

In that form the bill passed, but it was later recalled for a consideration of the amendment desired by Mrs. Kinney concerning the size of crabs.
