

Multnomah Gets Another Judge By Action Upon Veto

Everything from mild and harmless repartee to the harshest invective and abuse entered into the senate's debate yesterday afternoon on vetoed senate bill 31 of the 1925 session, providing for an additional circuit judge in Multnomah county. In both the senate and the house the bill passed over the veto of the governor. Upton was the only senate member voting against it, but a number of Multnomah senators who voted for it did so only because it was all left for them to do after failure of the so-called Ekwall bill to pass over the governor's veto earlier in the day.

In the debate on the Ekwall bill in the forenoon Senator Joseph, who opposed that measure, was asked whether he had assurance that the governor would appoint a judge under the 1925 measure if it passed over his veto. Joseph replied that he had, but did not know upon whom the appointment would fall.

Banks Flays Governor

As soon as word came from the house yesterday afternoon that the lower body had sustained the veto on the Ekwall bill Joseph moved that the old vetoed bill be taken from the table and voted on. The fireworks did not come until the latter end of the debate. Joseph spoke briefly for the bill and Klepper supported it in a speech on the floor. Banks, who was one of the introducers of the Ekwall bill, found himself in a position where he had to support the Joseph bill, and in explaining why he would vote for it took occasion to attack the governor. He said he favored the bill providing that W. A. Ekwall be the judge because he would rather have a republican than a democratic judge, and he attacked the democratic appointments that have been made by Governor Pierce. He predicted that in the next election the judge appointed by Pierce, whoever he might be, would be defeated by Ekwall.

Upton Flays Colleagues

Upton supported the 1927 vetoed bill and pointedly criticized the members of the Multnomah delegation for introducing the Ekwall bill. He declared that had "played a cheap game instead of employing a manly method" in their effort to get an additional judge.

Senator Garland one of the senate democrats, with rage in his voice, bitterly flayed Banks for his attack on the democrats and on the governor. He referred to Banks' speech as "unconscionable and disgusting."

"I have stood with the Multnomah delegation on many measures," said Garland, "although the Multnomah members have stood with me on hardly anything that I favored. I am going to vote for this bill," he said, directing his remarks at Banks, "so that you may get your new judge. But another remark from you, sir, such as you have just uttered, and I shall vote

against it."

Butler and Taylor spoke for the bill, Taylor expressing resentment at the remarks of Banks, Moore, Staples and Davis urged passage of the bill, Davis declaring that the governor could easily find a good democratic judge in Portland if he desired to appoint a democrat, and that politics should not be considered in a court appointment. Senator Hall spoke in favor of the measure.

Joseph Criticizes Methods

Joseph closed the debate with an acrimonious attack on the methods of his Multnomah colleagues, and other senate members.

"You came here to embarrass and harass the governor," he said. "First was the Riner bill to abolish the market agent's office and place grain inspection back in the public service commission. But an investigation showed that grain inspection has been efficient by administered, and we have never heard another word about that bill. Next, you attempted to shear the governor of his appointive power by giving it all the appointive power. Then came the Ekwall bill to legislative a judge into office. Yesterday we heard Senator Riner predict the recall of the governor. The governor has not been free from mistakes, but he has never freed a bunch of Chinese murderers from the state penitentiary. That was done by Riner when he accidentally happened to be governor for a few weeks. That act brought resentment from men, women and children all over the state, and had it been that he was an elected governor would have caused his recall. Why you talk about being republicans. You are no more republicans than the coyotes of eastern Oregon."

House Debate Bitter

After refusing to over-ride the veto on senate bill 193 which created a new circuit judgeship in Multnomah county and named Ekwall, the house yesterday afternoon did over-ride the veto of the governor on senate bill 31 of the 1925 session creating a judgeship, but without naming the judge.
