

FRENCH PUPILS CORRESPONDING WITH PARIS LAD

A sidelight on the experience of members of old company M of Salem, during their stay in France, has come into evidence in the French department of Salem high school. Letters have been written to Robert Huot, now 15 years old, and attending the Lycee of Henry IV in Paris. Allan Jones, member of company M, who started the ball rolling, received a letter from Paris yesterday thanking him for what he had started.

"He thanked me for the numerous correspondents he had received," said Jones. "Said he got a letter from a Salem high school girl the day he wrote."

It originally started in a music

store in the town of Rochefort, France, on the Bay of Biscay. Rochefort was a base port for the A. E. F. Tommy Coates and Allan Jones, both of Salem, were playing the piano in the store, which was owned by the elder Huot, marine commissioner. The two Americans from Salem attracted the attention of the commissioner, who invited them upstairs. Jones' acquaintance with the family, including young Robert Huot, who was then 7 years old, began at that time. Among other things Robert learned to sing "Hall, Hall, the Gang's All Here."

Last Christmas Jones sent a Christmas card to Robert. It met with a prompt reply, written in English. "I am now grown up," wrote Robert, "and going to school in Paris. Can you not send me the name of someone of my own age with whom I may correspond?"

Jones reported the letter to J. C. Nelson, principal of the high school, who spoke about it to the French department of the school. The result was that several members of the French IV class, taught by Miss Christensen, wrote to

letter to Jones being the only indication that the letters from Salem had arrived.

Robert indicated that he was much surprised to find that boys and girls go to the same schools in America. They don't allow them to do that way in France, he says.

Incidentally arrangements are under way to have an entire French class, taught by Miss Townsend, correspond with a class somewhere in France. Each class member will write in his own native tongue, leaving it to the student at the other end to do the translating. The correspondence by Miss Townsend's class is to be done through a bureau in the eastern part of the United States.

The Salem students who wrote to Robert Huot are expecting their replies to arrive within a few days.
