

SALEM HIGH FIVE DEFEATS ANGELS BY 22 TO 6 SCORE

In a slow hotless basketball game marked by erratic playing on both sides, the Salem high school five walked away with the Mt. Angel college second team on the local floor last night by a score of 22 to 6.

In the first quarter Salem took the lead and was never headed. At the end of the quarter the score stood 6 to 3 and at the end of the half the score stood 14 to 6. In the last half the visitors failed to score a point although they had several free shots. Several of the Mt. Angel shots went in and out again but they did not show any team work, taking most of their shots from long distances. Salem missed several easy shots under the basket.

The game was rough with ten persons called on the Salem side and nine on the Mt. Angel five. The visitors converted two fouls out of twelve shots and the locals marked up two points out of eleven free throws. In the last quarter Huntington sent in a whole new team with the exception of John Drager, center for the locals.

Ellis was high point man for the game with nine markers to his credit while Heenan and Duffy tied for second place honors on the Salem side. Myers was high point man for the visitors with old field goal and two free throws to his credit. The locals have no more games scheduled until the state tournament. They will rest until that time unless they are able to get a good team for some date between then. It was thought that Salem was to have played the Mt. Paris, March 5.—The weather has changed abruptly since Sunday and there has been a succession of gales, accompanied by snow, sleet or rain. Heavy seas, approximating the proportions of a tidal wave, destroyed or sank a large number of fishing boats at St. Tropez, St. Maxime and Cap-d'Auranne. MOUNTAIN LAKE IS DRAINED BY TUNNEL BORING

Denver, Colo., Mar. 5.—Slowly diminishing through subterranean channels, waters of Crater lake, 1200 feet from the Moffat tunnel, on the crest of the continental divide, are leaking into the great railroad bore, it has been officially and scientifically determined, according to authorities.

The seepage which began thru the rock seams in the eastern portal of the tunnel February 11, at

the rate of 600 gallons a minute has dwindled to about 250 gallons a minute and the lake today is nearly empty.

This phenomena has been without detriment to workers building the six mile tunnel through the heart of the Rocky mountains to provide faster transcontinental rail connections despite nature's own barrier in the expansive mountain range.

The flow of water into the tunnel was at first believed by striking an underground reservoir. Since February 19 officials employed scientific analysis with the result that chloride of lime poured into the lake has seeped its way into the tunnel.

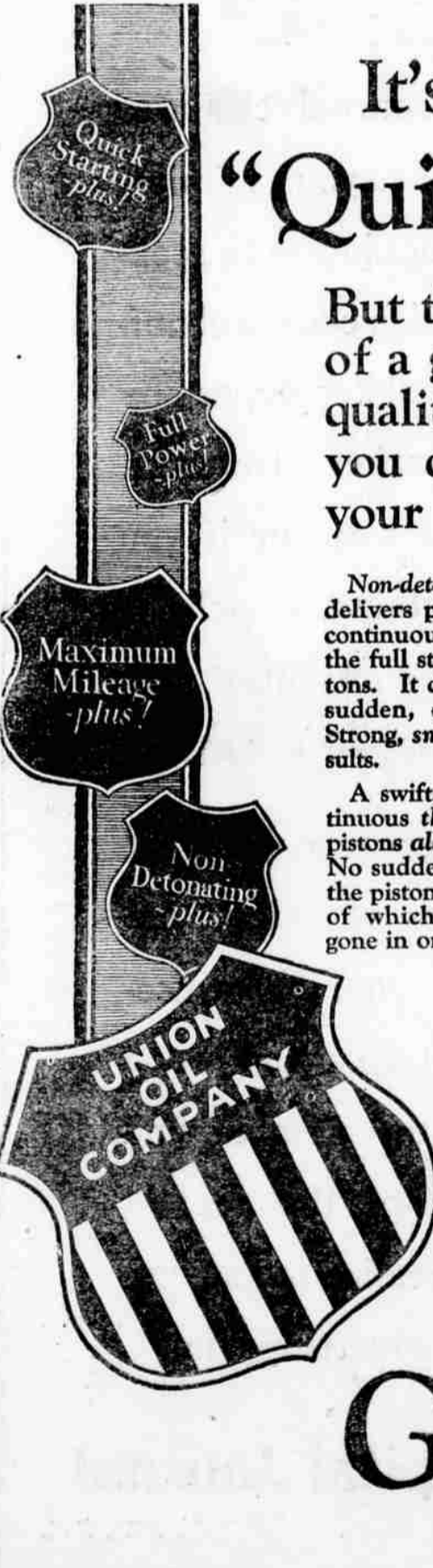
