

## 2 AMENDMENTS TO GORDON BILL FOUND MISSING

House bill 401, Representative Herbert Gordon's mutual savings bank bill, as signed by the governor is not in the amended form that the legislature intended to pass. Two important amendments made by the senate and which were agreed upon by a conference committee of the two houses were left out of the enrolled bill, apparently through error of the house enrolled bills committee. The question is whether, since the measure has been signed by the governor, anyone has authority to have it re-enrolled in amended form.

In section 8 of the printed bill is a sentence relating to agreements between mutual bank incorporators and the state superintendent of banks, which in the original bill reads: "Such agreement or undertaking shall fix the maximum liability assumed thereby, which shall be a reasonable amount approved by the superintendent of banks, and the same shall be secured to his satisfaction, which security in his discretion may be by a surety bond executed by a domestic or foreign corporation authorized to transact, within this state, the business of surety."

This sentence as amended read: "Such agreement or undertaking shall fix the liability of the incorporators jointly and severally for such reasonable amount as may be approved or determined by the superintendent of banks, and in addition to the undertaking of the incorporators jointly and severally, the superintendent of banks may require a surety bond executed by a domestic or foreign corporation authorized to transact, within this state, the business of surety."

The second sentence after the above was stricken out by amendment, but in the bill as signed by the governor remains in the measure. It reads: "Such agreement or undertaking and such security need not be made or furnished unless the superintendent of banks shall require the same."

The errors are considered particularly serious since the mutual banking bill is one of the most important acts passed by the legislature, and by some members was considered the most important.

**BIRTHPLACE MEMORIAL FOR WILSON PLANNED**

Staunton, Va., March 6.—Initial steps have been taken by citizens of Staunton to organize a national Woodrow Wilson birthplace memorial committee. President Edwin A. Alderman of the University of Virginia, a lifelong friend of the late president, has accepted chairmanship of the committee and will direct a drive to establish as a nation shrine and permanent memorial the birthplace here of the World War president.

## CHINESE PAY CLAIMS FOR BANDIT DAMAGES

Peking, China, March 6.—(By Associated Press.)—The American legation today was authorized by the state department to pay claims of Americans for acts of banditry committed by Chinese when the Shanghai-Peking express train was raided by bandits on May 26, 1923, and 300 persons were taken to a temple at Fortness Paotulku and held for ransom.

The money satisfying the claims was paid recently by the Chinese government.

length of the telephone line between Washington and San Francisco via New York is about 3600 miles, the greatest distance over which pictures have ever been transmitted electrically and the transmission time was only seven minutes.

This system of transmitting pictures electrically was first pictorially tested in essentially its present form in May, 1924. The present demonstration is in anticipation of the opening of a transcontinental picture transmission service shortly to be announced by the American Telephone and Telegraph company.

**Result of Experiments**

The system is a development of the engineers of the American Telephone and Telegraph company and the Bell Telephone Laboratories, incorporated. It is the outcome of work covering several

years and provides a simple, rapid and accurate picture transmitting system which will operate over a telephone line. The apparatus represents the association of many recent inventions by telephone engineers together with standard types of telephone and telephone apparatus which have been readapted to this new use.

The simplicity of the method is such that a positive transparency film is suitable for transmission. The apparatus is so designed as to transmit a picture five inches by seven inches in seven minutes. The picture is received in such form that, after photographing, it is practically indistinguishable from an ordinary photograph and is ready for newspaper or other reproduction. Line drawings, handwriting, and printing can also be transmitted. As films can be used for transmission while still wet, this system eliminates the delay which would otherwise be caused by drying and by making special sending plates.

**Mechanism is Simple**

The film upon which a picture has been transferred is inserted in the transmitter simply by rolling it

up in a cylindrical form. During operation a very small and intense beam of light shines through the film onto a photoelectric cell within. The film is rotated at a uniform speed and by means of a

upon the demand which arises for this type of service. As has been demonstrated in previous tests, the system is also applicable to radio transmission of pictures when atmospheric conditions are such that steadiness of transmission and freedom from interference can be assured.

At the receiving end an unexposed photographic film is rotated under a beam of light in a manner similar to that at the transmitting end. The two films are caused to rotate at exactly the same rate, the amount of light reaching the film at the receiving end.
