Lecture at Arts League Tomorrow

Howard Everts Weed, landscape architect, a man devoted to the idea of "The City Beautiful" and well known as a lecturer on the subject, will talk in Salem, under the auspices of the civic arts section of the Salem Arts League, tomorrow evening at eight o'clock in the auditorium of the city library.

Mr. Weed is widely traveled and has lectured in all sections of the United States. He carries a message of "A More Beautiful America" wherever he goes. He attempts to build up civic pride; create a desire for clean streets, well kept yards, rightly laid, artistic buildings, beautiful homes and a general air of prosperity and well being.

Mr. Weed will speak on "A More Beautiful Salem," illustrating his talk with over 100 stereoscopic views showing by example and comparison what has been done in other cities and what can be done for Salem. He covers every field of civic art and landscape gardening and at the close of the lecture the local application of these subjects will be mentioned, and the particular needs of this community brought out.

The Harriman (Tenn.) Record says of the speaker, "Mr. Weed is a man thoroughly imbued with his subject, and made many telling points which were emphasized by the fine stereoscopic views showing vividly the contrast between tasteful, well kept grounds and those that have been neglected."

This lecture is free to the public, and the Salem Arts League cordially invites everyone to come and hear Mr. Weed.

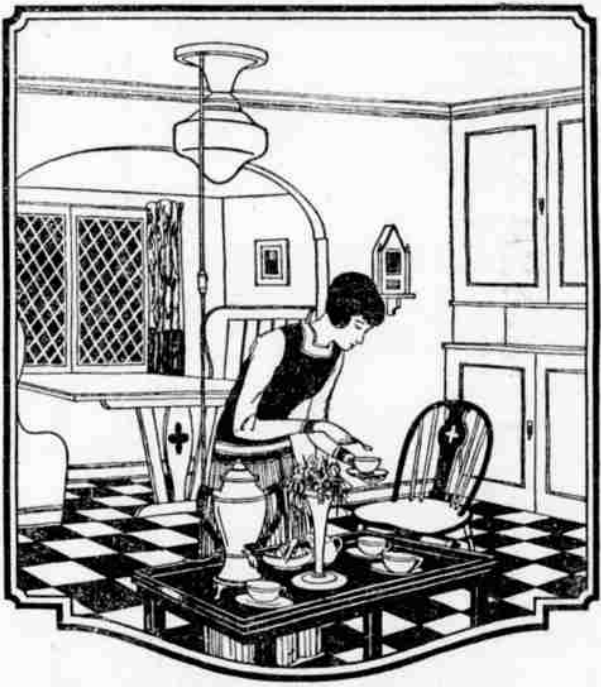
