

POLICE CALLED TO QUELL RIOT ON FREE SPEECH

New York, March 10.—Dissension over the question of freedom of speech in soviet Russia so disturbed a session of the international committee for political prisoners in the town hall last night that the police interfered and ordered that the meeting be closed.

No arrests were made, the crowd contenting itself by directing abuse toward the officers, including Norman Haggood, the chairman.

The disorder arose when a letter from Arturo Giovannitti, Italian communist, who had been scheduled to speak, was read. He stated that he was not sympathetic with the meeting, adding that freedom in the United States was not equal to that in soviet Russia. For these reasons, he wrote, he would not speak.

Roger Baldwin, of the American Civil Liberties Union, gained the floor and shouted:

"There is no freedom of speech in soviet Russia."

"It's a lie," roared cheers for soviet Russia," came a shout from the audience.

This brought the 1500 present to their feet. Any number of speakers tried to gain the floor at once, the police stepped in and Mr. Haggood left the hall, as he said, "dismayed."

Aggie Tossers Nose Out Victory as Gun Ends Hard Contest

When Westergren, University of Oregon guard, failed to convert a free throw after the gun sounded in the Oregon-O. A. C. basketball game last night, he gave to the Aggies the championship of the northern section of the Pacific coast conference and the right to meet California to decide the coast tilt. Westergren's scrappy playing had been a feature of the whole game, but with the score standing 27 to 26 in favor of O. A. C., and playing time completely gone, the ball struck the right rim of the basket, hesitated and fell away. It was believed by many spectators that if he had made the try promptly, instead of waiting several minutes as he did, the result might have been different.

The game itself was of the kind seen once in a lifetime. Each team took a slight lead four different times, the longest lead being one of five points, held by Oregon late in the second period. The count was tied four different times. The first half ended 13 to 13.

Okerberg Is Star.

The jumping of Okerberg, Oregon pivot man, was one of the greatest factors in the game. He consistently took the ball from Brown, his first opponent, and later from Diwocky, who was sent in the second half.

DOG LICENSE LAW HELD EFFECTIVE THIS YEAR

District Attorney Carson today advised the county court that the new dog license law is effective as of this year, and that the double tax provided for delinquents under the law will become effective 60 days after the act goes into effect in May.

The court is much exercised over the dog license situation, as during the last month 106 claims for damages for slain sheep have been received and the preceding month 55 claims came in. Without heavy license payments the dog license fund will soon be exhausted, as claimed for slaughtered sheep are paid from the license fund.

It also has been decided to start selling tags instead of collars as soon as the present supply of collars is exhausted, even if exhausted before the tax law goes into effect. This is as a matter of economy.

WASHBURN SUES MOVIE COMPANY

Des Moines, Iowa, Mar. 9.—Three damage suits, aggregating \$153,000 were filed in district court today by Bryant Washburn, screen star from Hollywood, Cal. Mrs. Elsie Schlob of San Francisco and Raymond Morgan of Fort Worth, Texas, against the Comic Production company and H. A. Devaux, under whose sponsorship ten motion picture actors left Hollywood on a personal appearance tour of the United States and Canada.

Mr. Washburn asks \$150,000 because of the appearance of his name in newspaper articles relating to the arrest here of six of his colleagues on Omaha warrants charging them with defrauding the hotel Fontenelle of that city. He also seeks \$3000 as four weeks' salary. Mrs. Schlob requests \$4000, loaned to Devaux and \$200 for salary. Morgan alleges he received only \$5 from Devaux and seeks a \$50 judgment.

RATE CASE AGAIN ARGUED IN COURT

Circuit Judge Kelly and MeMahon today heard arguments by attorneys representing the O. W. R. & N. and Southern Pacific railroads and the public service commission in connection with an appeal from an order of the commission reducing intrastate rates on farm products from 10 to 20 per cent on the various products.

The appeal was once heard before Judge Bingham who remanded the case to the commission for taking of further testimony. In the meantime Judge Bingham died and it is necessary to have the case re-argued.

SECOND LARGEST STAR ECCENTRIC

Chicago, Mar. 10.—The behavior of Myra, hailed by astronomers as the second largest known body in the universe, has always been eccentric, with a maximum brilliance 10,000 times greater than its minimum, said Professor Phillip Fox, director of the Dearborn observatory of Northwestern university, commenting on observations of the star made at the Mount Wilson, Cal., observatory.

"Sometimes it is nearly as bright as the pole star," said Professor Fox. "Again it fades below the sight of the naked eye."

"What is happening? Well, it is a young giant star, and perhaps it gets blanketed and then struggles until it breaks forth again in its real brilliancy."

Professor Forest Ray Moulton of the University of Chicago, contributed figures and historical data on Myra, which Fabritius discovered in 1596.

Myra has a diameter of 250,000,000 miles, with a volume 11,200,000 times that of the earth and 26,000,000 times the volume of the sun, said Professor Moulton.

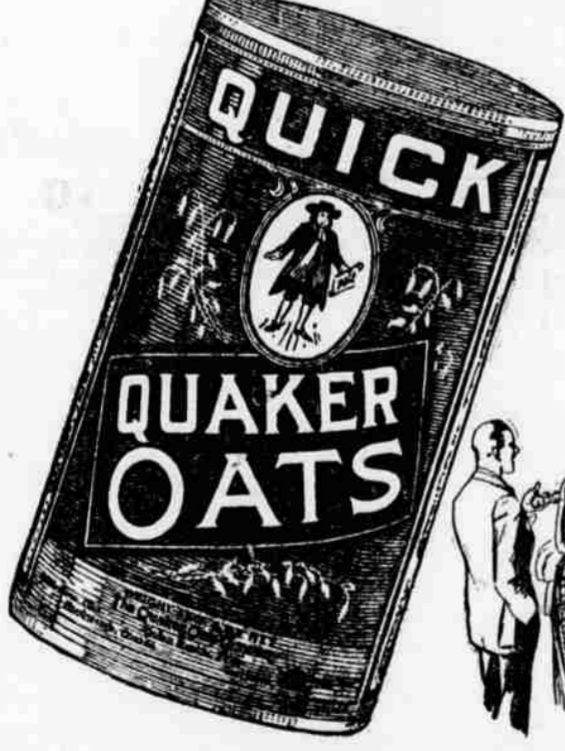

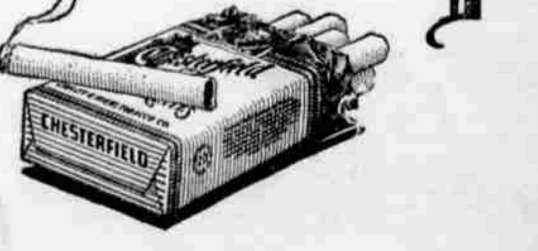
