MEAT EATING DIVIDES SECT

Nelson, H. C., Mar. 14.—Differences in religious opinions threaten to split a Donkhor colony of this district into two factions, it was revealed here last night when 500 members under the leadership of Larson W. Veregin, nephew of Peter Veregin, who was killed in an explosion aboard a railroad train last year, selected the name of Peter Veregin's christian community of universal brotherhood for their colony.

The nephew said that the break from the main body, the christian community of universal brotherhood, was due to Peter Veregin, Jr., who was elected head of the organization after his father's death, and who is in Russia, not being a true follower of his father "having deserted him and being addicted to the use of meat, tobacco and liquor."

They claim that the late Peter Veregin gave his blessing as prospective leader to Anastasia Holub, one of the seceders.

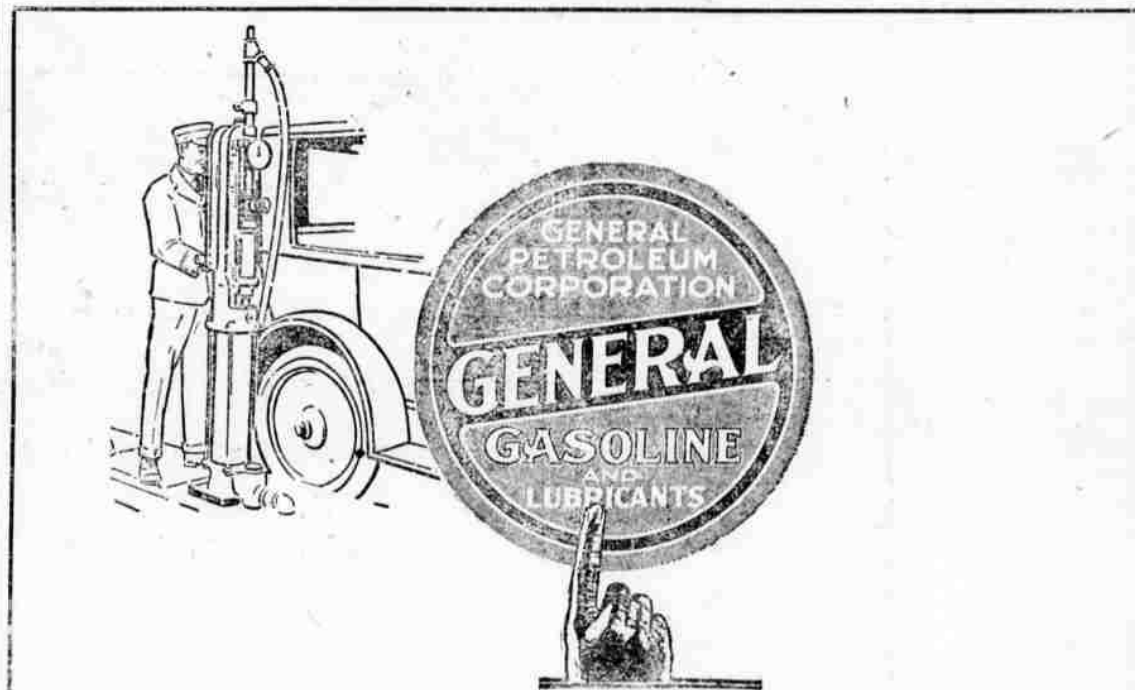

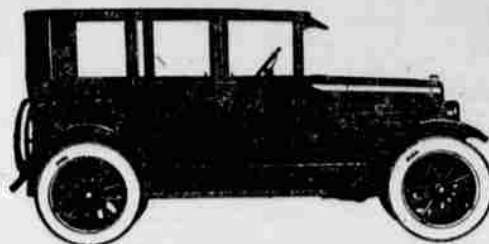

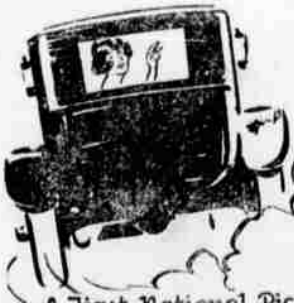
