

BODY OF OREGON MAN FROZEN IN NORTH RETURNED

Dutch Harbor, Alaska, March 17.—(By Associated Press.)—The gasoline schooner Daisy arrived Monday with the body of H. Dennehy, manager for the Western Livestock company, Portland, Or., who perished in a storm on Unalaska island, on the Aleutian chain. Dennehy's body was found after many other efforts had failed, by watching his dog through a field glass.

Dennehy was lost while he was crossing Unalaska island by the Pacific ocean to the Bering sea with Ralph Stacy, of the Aleutian Livestock company. These concerns have been engaged for two years in initiating sheep raising on the island.

Dennehy and Stacy became bewildered in a fog. After wandering all night they agreed to separate for better hope of finding the way. Stacy reached Chernofski, their headquarters, at the opposite end of the island from Dutch Harbor, and set out on horseback to the spot where he had parted with Dennehy. Dennehy was not found then, nor by parties that went out afterward. Dennehy's dog was left at Chernofski alone and returned.

In the Daisy, Rex Sproat, manager of the Aleutian Livestock company, went to Chernofski, 75 miles from here. Hearing of the dog's trips, Sproat had the animal watched when he went out again to a man on a hill with a glass. The dog went to Dennehy's body and nudged it. The body lay six miles from Chernofski. Indications were that Dennehy had fallen asleep and frozen to death.

Levens filed his bond with the secretary of state yesterday and announced that he may not continue the office of the department in Portland where it has been maintained by George L. CITY TREASURER GETS HIGHER PAY

The salary of City Treasurer C. O. Rice is increased \$10 a month, or from \$1560 to \$1620 a year by an ordinance passed by the city council last night and made effective from January 1, this year.

Another ordinance passed last night prohibits vehicles driving across sidewalks in Salem except those used in excavations for buildings or to deliver building materials to buildings under construction or repair.

The ordinance requiring the Oregon Pulp & Paper company to cover the artificial water way on Division street was passed with an amendment changing the date of beginning the work from March 1 to May 1 and the date for completion from July 1 to September 1. Another amendment fixes one limit of the improvement at a point 20 feet east of Liberty street instead of at High street.

The council went into committee of the whole to amend the last two bills mentioned above.

SALE OF SMOKES NEAR SCHOOLS TO GO UNDER BAN

The keeping of cigarettes or any other form of tobacco for sale within 250 feet of any public school building would be prohibited in Salem by an ordinance bill that was introduced at the city council meeting last night and which will be passed upon at the next meeting.

Stores selling tobacco in some districts of the city, near public school buildings, have been complained of, and the ordinance takes cognizance of this complaint.

A license tax of \$25 a year would be imposed upon for hire automobiles that are kept by some of the garages in the city and which are let with or without drivers, by an ordinance introduced last night by Alderman Wenderoth. This is the same license fee that is required of taxicabs in Salem.

Another ordinance bill introduced by Wenderoth would repeal the steamboat license act of 1909, which is said to be obsolete.

Another bill by Wenderoth is expected to excite some controversy. This would change the time of the curfew signal each night from 9 to 10 o'clock. Mayor Giesy said he would veto the measure if passed in the form in which it was introduced.
