

HEALTH WORK IN COUNTY OPENED UP OFFICIALLY

With announcement by Dr. Walter H. Brown that the child health demonstration headquarters will officially open in the William Brown home, 574 State street the first of the week, with the first permanent member of the staff here and arrangements made with the medical association and school authorities for active co-operation the five years of work to be carried on here is virtually officially opened, or will be by next week.

The Marion-Polk-Yamhill Medical society has appointed Drs. Morse, Rockwell and Clement as an advisory committee to work with the demonstration and Superintendent Hug and Pulliamson will assist in arrangement of the work through the schools.

The Brown home will be ready to function as a health center in about 20 days, states the head of the demonstration, and in this center studies of children will be made as a health proposition. The study will be made of presumably healthy children and not of children who are suffering from illness or disease. The primary object of the demonstration is to find better ways of living to decrease child mortality.

When this center is functioning an additional staff member will be installed in charge of it, some specialist in children's diseases and welfare.

The first permanent member of the staff to come is Miss Evelyn McKay, graduate of the University of British Columbia, who also has taken graduate work at the University of California and Bryn Mawr college. Her home is at Everett, Wash. She will have charge of all of the statistical work of the organization, or as Dr. Brown puts it, auditor of the accomplishments of the organization. The work in the outlying districts, Dr. Brown announces, will be largely ambulatory and be carried on in districts as they seek it.

"I cannot be too emphatic in stating that we are not trying to compel anyone to take what we have," states Dr. Brown. "If we find anything good it is for a community to take it if it wishes to use it. Also, I wish to have it distinctly understood that this is not a government function and that no money spent by it comes from the public in any way. It is all financed by the commonwealth fund, a purely philanthropic project, growing up out of a desire of the founder to do something that will make life a better thing for children to live, and consequently something better for future citizens."

The larger of the two hothouses belonging to Charles K. Ogura on Lake Labish meadows was destroyed by fire Tuesday night. Estimated loss about \$400.
