BRYAN WORTH MILLION NOW DECLARES FRIEND

Lincoln, Neb., March 20.—William Jennings Bryan, three times candidate for president of the United States and power in democratic politics for years, yesterday reached the age of 65 years, and in connection with the celebration of the commoner's birthday anniversary, Judge C. H. Slama of Wahoo, who has just returned from Mr. Bryan's home at Miami, Fla., said that shortly after Mr. Bryan moved from Lincoln he bought Miami real estate valued at \$35,000 which has now increased in value to a quarter of a million dollars. Additional purchases, he said, had increased the Bryan estate to \$1,000,000. "His good fortune is talked of on every hand," Judge Slama declared.

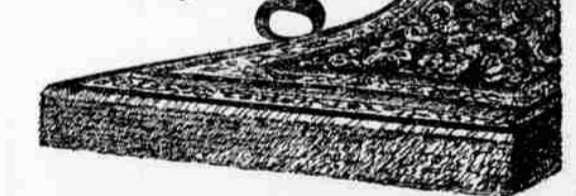
BORDER DISPUTE ENDED, IS REPORT

Geneva, March 20.—(By Associated Press.)—The frontier dispute between Poland and Lithuania has been settled.

Lithuania protested to the league of nations early this week against an alleged attack on Lithuanian frontier guards by Polish patrols.

A communique given out by the Lithuanian legation in Paris said the Poles attacked without provocation last Monday night and had threatened to occupy the district of Sirvintal by force of arms unless the Lithuanians evacuated it.

DEATH SUMMONS MARQUIS CURZON

London, Mar. 20.—(By Associated Press.)—Death today claimed the Marquis Curzon, of Kedleston, lord president of the council and former foreign secretary. The end came at 5:35 o'clock this morning after a fight against pneumonia which developed following his operation of two weeks ago.

The marquis was 66 years old. The first indication of the break in his health came on March 6, when he collapsed while dressing for a public dinner at Cambridge, at which he was to have delivered a speech.

The collapse was marked by faintness and nasal hemorrhage. The regular medical bulletins regarding his condition failed to name the malady, but "bladder trouble" was generally given as the cause of his collapse.

RICKARD CONVICTED OF TRANSPORTING FILMS

Trenton, N. J., Mar. 20.—Sentence will be passed Tuesday on Tex Rickard, promoter of sporting events, convicted with four others last night of conspiracy and interstate transportation of films of the Dempsey-Carpentier prize fight.

Rickard was found guilty on one count of conspiracy and on two of transportation of the films. For the conspiracy charge the law provides a maximum penalty of two years imprisonment in a federal penitentiary, or a fine of \$10,000 or both. For transportation the defendant may be fined \$1000 on each count.
