TURNER TO OPEN NEW CHURCH ON EASTER SUNDAY

Announcement is made by S. E. Edicott of Salem that dedication of the new memorial church at Turner is planned for Easter Sunday, probably with the Rev. Sanderson of Eugene delivering the dedicatory sermon.

The memorial church is a gift to Turner by Mrs. Cornelia Davis in memory of her brother George, and it is understood will cost in the neighborhood of \$40,000.

While not the largest, Mr. Edicott declares it is the best constructed church on the coast, being of solid, reinforced concrete and with a careful arrangement to give the best possible service for all church purposes.

"I have stood on a road made by Julius Caesar and have seen the Coliseum at Rome, and neither of these were constructed with the same fine materials and effort that have been put into the new church at Turner," asserted Edicott.

The church structure, he states, is 60x75, will seat about 450 people, has a full basement equipped with kitchen, dining room, ladies' work room, toilets, and various rooms for different uses. It has a large assembly hall, Sunday school rooms and all modern desired.

The Davis family laid out the town of Turner and the church is largely as a gift to the town as well as a memorial.

Mr. Edicott has had active charge of the construction of the edifice for Mrs. Davis.

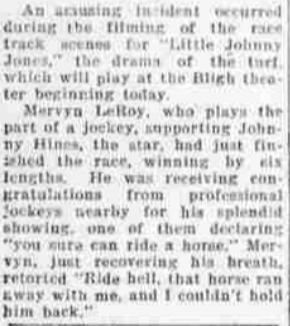
Ingre's wooden leg served as a prop for the overturned car which crushed the other two men. He is in a serious condition.

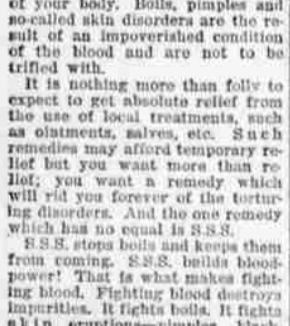

MURPHYSBORO TO RISE AGAIN CITIZENS STATE

Murphysboro, Ill., Mar. 22.—"Murphysboro will rebuild." It was one of the heaviest losers as a result of the tornado who issued the defiance at a citizens meeting held here yesterday.

Charles Ritter, a business man, uttered it after Governor Small and a dozen relief work officials and commissioners painted the horrors of the tornado. Ritter said, "The relief activities," Ritter said, "can be only temporary. It is what will happen after the temporary relief measures that concern us mostly."

"The Mobile and Ohio shops are destroyed. The Brown Shoe company's factory is gone. There alone were jobs for 2,000 people. We must prepare for the future and bring hope to the stricken by assuring them that their jobs will come back."

"The banks of this town are prepared to strain their credit to the utmost to aid its people in restoring their lost homes and industry."

"Murphysboro and you will build on its ruins. It may take years to get back our old status, but Murphysboro will rebuild."

Ritter, one of the town's wealthiest men, striking looking with white hair and ruddy cheeks, climbed down from the speaker's platform with tears in his eyes and Murphysboro uttered the first cheers that swept over it since the disaster.
