

VALSETZ PEOPLE SEEKING VALLEY OUTLET BY ROAD

Dallas, Or., March 26.—Residents and auto owners at Valsetz are becoming much interested in the opening and improvement of the Falls City-Valsetz road across the mountains to permit them to travel back and forth from that district to valley points and allow others to enter.

They are so much interested that they have already signed up 60 men for a day or more of volunteer road work and promise at least 100 after calling a mass meeting. They are seeking the help and co-operation in the matter of the Dallas chamber of commerce and also wish the county court to aid with some equipment at least.

The stretch of road, as it now stands, is a summer road only, although with some work its usefulness could be greatly extended, at the Falls City end of the proposed Falls City-Newport highway that will some day make the most direct route to the Lincoln county beaches available to the valley points north of Corvallis.

The Valsetz people wish to fill in the rutted portions, widen the grades in places and remove slides that have accumulated during wet weather. The county court has instructed its supervisor for that district to look into the matter but it is not known how much help can be expected from the county, owing to the condition of road funds.

The Valsetz residents have no other road outlet to the valley and must travel over the Valley & Flets railroad when this road is impassable for cars.

FRENCH BIRTHS STILL FALLING

Paris, Mar. 26.—The French birth rate continues to decline, according to the vital statistics for last year, just completed.

The births numbered 732,101 and the deaths 679,885, the excess of births over deaths being 52,216 as compared with 55,009 for the preceding year.

Dr. Variet, authority on vital statistics remarks that but for the population of the recovered province of Alsace-Lorraine where large families are still usual, the situation would be much worse.

According to figures gathered by him, the number of births steadily increased in France from the beginning of the nineteenth century and reached their peak during the second empire, with over 1,000,000 annually. After the war of 1870 they began to drop. Thus in 1874 there were 967,000 births; in 1886, 907,000; in 1890, 867,000 and in 1907, 774,000.

The doctor observes that the birth rate in Germany has begun to fall.
