

BATTLE CRUISER TO CARRY PRINCE ON LATEST TOUR

Plymouth, Eng., Mar. 26.—(By Associated Press)—Everything is in readiness aboard H. M. S. Repulse for the Prince of Wales voyage to South Africa and South America, beginning Saturday. The battle cruiser has been scrubbed and polished until she looks like a jeweled ship, with brass and nickel blinding in the sun and decks and sides spotless.

The twelfth successive man of war to bear that name under the Union Jack, the Repulse will be the crack ship of his majesty's fleet during the time the prince is aboard. Only the best of officers and tars have been chosen to accompany the prince and every day life on board while Wales' standard is at the foremast will be a display of rigid discipline and tidiness.

When other craft dip their flags in salute they will be paying homage to a living example of the splendor of British sea power—a fighter 784 feet long, of 35,000 tons, carrying a main battery of six 15 inch guns and a crew of 1250 men with engines capable of hurling the whole mass through the water at 3 knots an hour.

At the time the prince is aboard he plans to carry a daily program of gymnastics in much the same manner as he occupies himself while at St. James palace. His quarters on the Repulse will contain a gymnasium, barroom, bath and smoking room.

The gymnasium, a virtual reproduction of the one at the palace, with the addition of the usual apparatus of a mechanical horse, to substitute for the hunting rides in which Wales has indulged extensively this year.

"Anything will do for sleeping quarters," the prince said, "but I want a complete gymnasium handy."

AMBASSADORS MEET IN ROUTINE BUSINESS

Paris, March 26.—(By Associated Press)—The ambassadors council met today but took up only routine affairs.

The much talked of list of questions which were to be put to the allied war committee concerning ways and means of obliging Germany to respect the disarmament clause of the Versailles treaty is still in the embryo and it now is expected that the questions will be held up until something further develops in the security negotiations.

The French government is ready for its part, to take immediate action on the report of the allied military control commission although it is willing to wait the pleasure of the British as long as the Cologne bridgehead remains occupied.

20,000 POLISH COUPLES SECURE DIVORCES

Warsaw, March 26.—The discovery that 20,000 Polish Catholic couples have obtained divorces by joining the Russian orthodox church is causing concern to the Polish government, which is considering measures to restrict the movement.

The Russian church shares the Polish objections to the practice and has instructed all the church authorities to handle divorce cases with the greatest care, refusing to consider any case if the parties have belonged to the church for less than a year.

PROBE REVEALS BRANDED MAN'S LIFE INSURED

Sacramento, Cal., March 26.—The investigation in Butte county into the branding of Herman H. Schalow, Gridley-Biggs rancher who died in an Oroville hospital last week, has expanded from an inquiry into the strange practice of a fanatical religious cult to one with more serious ramifications when it was announced that an insurance policy for \$2000 was taken out on Schalow's life prior to the branding, says the Sacramento Bee.

Existence of the insurance policy, in which the widow is named as beneficiary was made known from Redding, where an insurance agent received the policy from a Los Angeles company with instructions to make full payment to Mrs. Schalow today.
