

LIGHTNING HITS PRISON; FREAK COURSE TRACED

Among the places visited by the elements early Monday afternoon, one capricious bolt of lightning broke in and out of the state penitentiary at 12:45. The bolt first struck a tree behind the guards' quarters. It tore a wire netting from its post and passed into the cell house breaking four windows, striking a lever which is used to open the cell door. From there the bolt went up to the tin roof of the building, burning one edge, and passing down a drain pipe on the outside to the machine shop. Lightning also struck a corner of one of the new flax sheds, 500 yards away from the main building, knocking a watchman down but not injuring him. There were no injuries due to the lightning. It is thought that the flax shed would probably have caught fire had it not been for the heavy shower of rain that preceded the thunder shower.

POSTS \$10,000 FORFEIT TO OBEY LIQUOR LAWS

Philadelphia, Pa., March 31.—A legal agreement with a \$10,000 forfeit for violation, binds Samuel M. Vaulain, president of the Baldwin Locomotive Works, to strict observance of the Volstead act while in this country. It was learned today, Mr. Vaulain signed the agreement with the late W. A. Garrett, A. S. Goble and W. A. Hoy, Baldwin officials, on May 15, 1924, the others agreeing to forfeit \$10,000 each if they violated it. Mr. Vaulain disclosed the agreement on his 68th birthday, while en route through Texas on his private car. The agreement, it was said, cites the desire of the signers to obey the laws, "not only because they are right, but also because it will result in mental, moral and physical good."

Packings Firm Reorganizing
Chicago, March 30.—(By Associated Press.)—Re-organization of Wilson & Company, packers, which has been in the hands of receivers, is under way today in New York and Chicago and may be affected late today or tomorrow, it was learned today.

BURGLAR SHOOTS OWN REFLECTION IN GLASS

Culver City, Cal., March 31.—Police today are looking for the burglar who smashed a looking glass at the Jewish orphan home here. The intruder apparently mistook his reflection in the glass for a night watchman, officers say; at least those who hastened to the home on hearing pistol shots think that was the case, for they found a full length mirror splintered with bullets and, abandoned nearby, a flashlight and the .38 caliber weapon from which the shots had been fired.

RUSSIAN TRAINS CRASH; 50 DEAD

Moscow, March 31.—(By Associated Press.)—More than 50 persons were killed or injured in a head-on collision between the Tashkent express and a Moscow suburban train last night. The disaster, which was one of the worst in Moscow's history occurred about a mile from the capital.

The locomotives were shattered and several of the passenger coaches reduced to fragments. Lack of derricks made difficult the work of extricating the victims pinned under the wreckage. The rescue parties also were hampered because of the darkness.
