SUSPICIOUS OF VANKEE GREED

Montevideo, Uruguay, Mar. 31.—(By Associated Press.)—Addressing an "open heart" meeting at which the South American delegates to the Christian Work Congress were invited to speak, Dr. Enrique Molina, dean of the University of Concepcion, Chile, last night declared that South Americans were skeptical of Pan-Americanism because it was an ideal corrupted by the commercial tendencies of the United States. He also asserted that the Pan-Americanism and the Monroe Doctrine had been unable to exist side by side, as they were contradictory, and that in fact the doctrine was a dead letter.

115 NEW RECORDS MADE IN INDOOR NEW YORK MEET

New York, March 1.—One hundred and fifteen world records have been made to date in the indoor track and field season, which virtually closed last Saturday night. Of this amazing total 61 marks still stand, the others being superseded.
Paavo Nurmi of Finland leads with 34 records, of which 15 still to his credit, most of the other 16 he himself has broken in subsequent meets through the east.
Spurred by Nurmi's unprecedented feats, American track stars have contributed their best to make this the greatest indoor season in the history of the sport.
To Willie Ritola, goes the honor of second place in the record total. He has broken 18 records since the first of the year, but has seen most of his performances fall before Nurmi.
Ugo Frigerio of Italy, Olympic walking champion, has made fifteen marks. Nine were made Saturday night, his American rival, William Plant, his American rival, in 10,000 meters race, of which Plant, with three defeats over Frigerio to his credit, has made six records and has held four of them.
Alan Helfrich, the Penn State runner, has proved a sensation, setting the remaining three world marks and losing only one race. Lloyd Hahn of the Boston Athletic Association, has lowered Nurmi's time for 1,500 meters and holds quarters of a mile and still holds those marks. Harold Geborne, high jumper, has broken his own record three times.
