

WORK REFUSES PLEA TO DEPOSE PROJECT HEAD

Klamath Falls, April 11.—Herbert D. Newell, project manager for the reclamation service on the Klamath irrigation district, will not be deposed by Secretary of the Interior Work.

This was made plain by the cabinet officer at a conference Friday morning when he told directors of the district that he preferred to keep Newell at his post and convert him into his idea of how the work should be done.

"When I first became secretary of the interior, the entire 24 project managers were in sympathy with the former director of reclamation," he said, "I could have thrown them all out of the window had I so desired, but instead, I worked with them and have convinced them that my policies are for the best interests of the settlers."

This answer was given in response to a demand by the irrigation directors yesterday that Manager Newell be relieved from his duties because of the discord between his office and the directors.

Secretary Work predicted that all such difficulties could be ironed out to the entire satisfaction of the settlers on the Klamath project.

VOODOO DOCTOR THOT MURDERER

Camden, N. J., April 10.—Prosecutor W. E. Scott said today that charges of murder might be lodged against H. H. Hygcock, negro voodoo doctor, whose home was raided by the police yesterday after his 7-year-old daughter said her father had killed a woman and buried her body in one of the secret passages under the house.

Bones of two infants, believed to have been negroes, were discovered in one of the underground passages. Three tunnels, with a score of rooms and compartments were found under the cellar. In the chambers were nodules of chickens, pieces of dry meat, wicker dressed and painted dolls and many bells.

Hygcock was arrested on charges of practicing medicine without a license, and obtaining money under false pretenses.

He was about to be released on bail when his daughter made her startling statement.

He also posed as a spiritualist, authorities said, and operated taxicabs in addition to a real estate business. He and his wife were held without bail. The girl was detained as a witness.

KLAN PAPER SUED FOR \$18,942 PRINTING BILL

Portland, April 11.—Suit for \$18,942.82, due for printing the Western American, Ku Klux Klan paper, was filed Thursday by Fred C. Dunham and Harriet Dunham, owners of the Dunham Printing company, against the Western American Publishing company.

The complaints aver that between November 3, 1924, and March 30, 1925, the printing plant had the contract to publish the paper, which has since been suspended, and that the total cost of the work was \$38,377.75, of which only \$9424.93 was paid.
