

MAJOR LEAGUES TO OPEN SEASON IN EAST TUESDAY

Chicago, April 13.—(By Associated Press.)—Tomorrow brings the event toward which the attention of baseball fans has been directed for long winter bound months, the first lap in the grueling race for supreme baseball honors with 16 entries starting from scratch.

Although the pre-season warming up of the National and American league clubs was marked by a disastrous list of casualties, each club faced the start of the 1925 season with confidence and with predictions of a better showing in all departments of the national game.

Even last year's cellar position teams indicated in cautious statements that they did not expect again to be last in the home scratch, Manager Dave Bancroft of the Boston Braves, tall ender in the National league promised "a more colorful, more interesting and I hope a more successful team than last season," while the morale of the Chicago White Sox, the 1925 finale markers of the American league was reported the highest since the 1919 world series with lots of enthusiasm in camp.

While injuries will keep a number of regulars out of the opening game an din some instances for a long period, resourceful managers expected successfully to plug their positions with veterans or new talent. Among the absentees will be the mighty Babe Ruth, who will hear the returns from a New York hospital. KILLED GIRL IN JEALOUS RAGE

London, April 13.—A story of fatal jealousy was told in police court today when Ernest Rhodes, 18-year-old valet, appeared to answer a charge of murdering Grace Blakaller, pretty 16-year-old actress and dancing instructor, who died Friday from the effects of a slash in the throat the night previous in the West Kingston district. A statement was read into the records, alleged to have been made by Rhodes to the police, admitting he had cut the girl's throat with a razor. The fatal act, as recorded in the statement, was committed impulsively in a fit of jealousy as he was bidding the young dancer good night outside her home on their return from a motion picture theater and she chaffed him about other boys she might see during the Easter holidays.

Rhodes said he was not aware he had slashed the girl fatally as she ran to her mother's home nearby and he did not know she was dead until two days later when he read the news in the papers. He then surrendered to the police. Rhodes was remanded for a week.

CHICAGO YOUTH TAKES OWN LIFE TO END FAILURE

Chicago, April 13.—Robert Preston, 21-year-old Northwestern university student and son of a wealthy Oak Park family, ended what he considered a "life of failures" with a strange death in Lake Michigan yesterday.

A bullet wound in the head and a brief case of diaries strapped to him, and weighed down with three heavy pieces of iron apparently explained the youth's self-confessed philosophy. "When you get to the end of your rope, tie a knot and hang yourself."

Coroner's physicians described the diaries as amazingly frank revelations of the phantasies of a modern youth. The doctors found a tragic story in the lad's confessions of his struggle against an insurable diabetic condition and in his consequent abandonment and indulgence in things which a rigorous diet forbade him.
