

MARION COUNTY JERSEY JUBILEE PLANS ARE LAID

At a meeting Saturday of the Marion County Jersey Cattle club plans were completed for Marion county day of the Oregon Jersey jubilee. At least 75 head of Jersey cattle are assured for the exercises, which will be held at the state fair grounds. Committees were appointed as follows:

The jubilee is an annual event having been held for five years. For three years participants toured the valley, visiting most of the principal herds. Last year a chalet was held at the state fair grounds. This year the jubilee will take the form of a series of county spring shows, which are scheduled as follows:

May 18—Columbia county at Scappoose; May 19—L. G. Smith Jersey sale at Scappoose; May 20—Clackamas county day at the Clackamas county fair grounds at Canby; May 21—Marion county day at the state fair grounds at Salem; May 22—Polk county day at Independence; May 23—Linn county day at the Linn county fair grounds at Albany; May 24—J. C. Brown & Son sale at Shedd; May 27—Stanley Richey and Warren Gray sale at Turner; May 28—Lane county day at L. G. Griggs & Son farm near Eugene.

At each place a cattle show and stock judging contests will be held. Members of boys and girls clubs as well as adults will judge the stock. It is expected that Mr. Van Pelt, director of the American Jersey Cattle club will be present and give a dairy cow demonstration each day.

FEW TOURISTS FROM SOUTH YET

The principal feature of tourist travel so far this year is the scarcity of travelers coming from California, compared with the number that usually come from that state. It is declared by those in charge of the Salem camp grounds. Many cars have been coming in, especially during the fair weather of the past week, but they are largely from Washington, Canada and the middle west. There have been registrations from Alberta, Missouri, Ohio and one from Florida. A few have come from California, but the usual proportion of California cars is distinctly missing. The home state of Oregon has its usual representation at the grounds.

The hoof and mouth disease in California last year, as well as a natural reaction from abnormal boom conditions in that state, are given as reasons for the lack of tourists there.

Mrs. Horace E. Dodge and her sister-in-law, Mrs. John F. Dodge principal owners in the Dodge Brothers Automobile Company, have sold the firm to Dillon, Read & Co. of New York, for a sum reported to be \$175,000,000. In 1921, the Dodge brothers were poor mechanics. They went into partnership with Henry Ford. Later they sold their Ford holdings and began manufacturing a car of their own.

Both Tillamook debaters are girls, and the Tillamook coach is a woman.

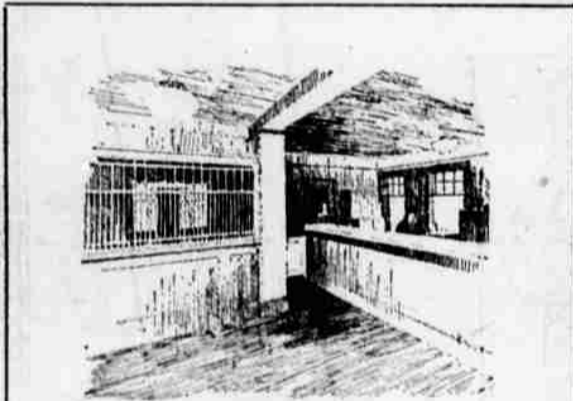
