

YEAR BOOK WILL BE UNUSUAL IN QUAIN DESIGN

Details of the 1926 Wallulah, Willamette university annual published by the junior class, were made public yesterday after being kept secret by staff members since work on the publication began.

The main feature of the book is its old colonial style, which is carried out in all art work even to the humorous section. The cover is to be of imitation leather, stiff, and colored cloth with a gold-colored design. The border design is to be of pearl gray. Panels have been made from photographs of cloth resembling old homespun. Much of the lettering has been made to resemble lettering done with a needle and thread in old colonial days.

The publication contains 300 pages, more than any previous Wallulah. It has seven sections and six double-edged inserts.

Loyal Warner, manager of the Wallulah, has stated that copies will be ready for distribution May 8, which is the beginning of junior week-end. Ann Silver is the editor.

The last of the copy was sent to the printer this week. It is to be printed and bound in Eugene.

This year's Wallulah is the last that will be published by the junior class at Willamette. Some 20 annual publications have been put out at the university, being published by the junior class each time with the exception of 1915, when the book was published by the seniors.

In accordance with recent action by the student body and by the trustees, future Wallulahas will be published by the whole student body organization and the price of the book added to the tuition fee and collected by the administration. Beginning next year, the total annual student body fee will be \$20, part of which will arbitrarily go for the purchase of an annual, whether the student wants to buy an annual or not. The same system has been used for years with the Collegian, weekly newspaper at the university. So far as is known Willamette is the only college in the country to apply the idea to an annual publication, others depending on the method discarded by Willamette, which involved a drive every year to sell the books.

HARCOMBE MANAGER OF DALLAS BALL CLUB

Dallas, Or., April 16.—W. W. Harcombe, local attorney, has been selected as manager of the Dallas baseball team, which will be one of six in the Polk County Baseball league. The league season will open a week from Sunday, April 26, with Dallas playing at Independence, Amity playing at either Mouthout or Grand Ronde (whichever is retained in the league) and Falls City at Valsetz.

Mr. Harcombe plans to finance the undertaking by the sale of season tickets to business men and baseball fans in Dallas. By this plan it is hoped to raise sufficient funds to give the team a good start and also to give receipts during the remainder of the season.

Under the league contract each team takes its own gate money and pays its traveling expenses.

Resolutions were adopted condemning the Dennis resolution that would place a constitutional restriction against state income and inheritance taxes in Oregon.
