

### ISLAND ON OAHU ARMED CAMP AS ATTACK PENDS

Honolulu, April 23.—(By Associated Press)—The island of Oahu far flung western outpost of the United States and key to the nation's web of defense in the Pacific was transferred by the black forces, defending the island from an attacking fleet, into a veritable armed camp. It was revealed to a correspondent of the Associated Press today after an inspection tour of all defenses on the island.

Just as the blue fleet, which is steaming towards the island from the east in an attempt to recapture the island from the land forces, is traveling under actual war conditions as far as possible, the army shore defenses have been arranged along lines which would be drawn in defending the island against actual instead of theoretical attack.

The Associated Press correspondent, accompanying Major G. H. Tenney of the military intelligence office, was permitted to view the defense at Fort Ruger which is situated on Diamond head, known as the Gibraltar of the Pacific. The island of Oahu today resembles an area under martial law, thousands of soldiers wearing khaki uniforms distinguishing black forces from neutral military men. Couriers, wearing red arm bands, lend a realistic touch to the scene today dashing to and from general headquarters.

Approximately 5000 miles of multi-colored telephone wires are strung along the roads, forming lines of communication from various artillery control spotting stations to battery headquarters.

Army and navy airplanes are circulating overhead continuously. Submarines, part of the black forces, stationed at Pearl Harbor, are constantly maneuvering in the outer harbor.

Sentinel posts the roads leading to the forts and mobile units due to the current rumor that spies are operating from the blue fleet against the land forces.

Trucks filled with officers and soldiers trundle through the city streets and rural roads, being shifted from one post to another to meet the problem of defending the islands as the danger from the enemy becomes apparent.

Although it is impossible to state the time of contact between the land and sea forces, it is believed that a clash will occur Friday night or Saturday morning.

Admiral Cootes and Major General John L. Hines today completed last minute plans for judging the maneuvers.

### PHOTOGRAPHS OF ALL KINDS SENT BY WIRE

Chicago, April 23.—Anything that can be photographed, from finger prints of criminals to elaborate interior decoration has been

accepted as a "message" by the American Telephone & Telegraph company, which has transmitted pictures of many varieties by wire. The most delicate detail, according to company officials, has been transmitted as distinctly as words.

One commercial use made of the new process was the sending of an advertising layout photographed from a plate of type from a New York firm to a Chicago newspaper in which it appeared the same day. Eleventh-hour revision in national advertising may be made by long distance.

An X-ray picture of a human hand was another message sent, demonstrating possibilities for medical purposes.

### TRAFFIC COP IDENTIFIED AS HIGHWAY ROBBER

Chicago, April 23.—Raymond F. Vinickey, 26, a traffic policeman, was held today after Patrolman James Gavin identified him as one of three robbers who kidnaped him and stole \$10,000 from a bank messenger he was guarding March 21.

### SENATE IGNORES CAILLAUX ENTRY

Paris, April 23.—(By Associated Press)—On the fifth anniversary of the day the senate, sitting as a high court, deprived him of his civic rights and banished him from Paris for war time commerce with the enemy, Joseph Caillaux made his re-entry into the senate chamber today as minister of finance.

The few senators present when the session opened did not appear to see him enter.

The expected hostile demonstration from the conservative and moderate benches failed to materialize. The senate went on with the debate on the articles of the budget while M. Caillaux scratched his bald head, exchanged a few words with Foreign Minister Brand, who sat beside him and from time to time gave indications that he was very much bored.
