

SALEM HI OPENS SEASON, TAKING INDIANS TO CAMP

Chenawa, April 23.—After many efforts to open their baseball season the Salem high school met the Chenawa Indians on the Indians grounds yesterday afternoon and defeated them by a score of 7 to 4. The rally for the last week or so have delayed the red and black nine which has helped them to a certain extent as it has given the players who were away on the baseball trip a chance to get going in good shape. WILL BUILD NEW GARAGE ON HIGH

A new concrete garage is to be built on North High, between Chomeketa and Center streets, it was announced yesterday. The building will be of reinforced concrete, with a brick exterior in front. It will measure 32 1/2 by 155 feet. The cost is estimated at \$15,000. The project is being financed by three Salem men, A. C. Nelson, E. E. Ling and A. J. Jacobs.

The garage will be occupied by Fred M. Powell, who deals in Packard, Hudson and Essex cars. There will be a service department and a show room. The show room will measure 48 by 70 feet. Property where the garage is to be built was bought a few weeks ago from its former owners. An old house, which now occupies the site, will be torn down. Freeman & Struble, local architects, drew up the plans.

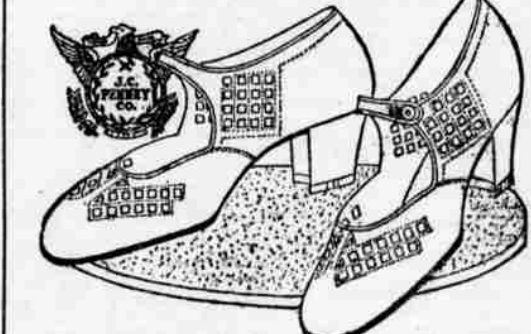
