None of the speakers knew what his subject was to be until he reached the platform, when he was allowed to draw a slip upon which was written the title of the speech he was required to give.

In the sight reading contest participants were given articles to read after they appeared on the platform. The contest was won by Floyd Query, senior. The junior representative, Margaret Pro, took second place.

The orations were prepared in advance, and were not original. Avery Thompson, senior, won the oratorical contest, giving Hanky's "The Sense of the Dramatic." Harold Tomlinson, junior, placed second, giving Woodrow Wilson's "The Meaning of the Constitution."

Interclass tennis and baseball have yet to be held as well as a debate between the juniors and seniors. These, with a contest Friday night in dramatic and humorous productions, will complete the interclass series at high school. Friday night's contest will be held in the high school auditorium, beginning at 8 o'clock.

DEFEND ISLAND FROM AIR RAIDS

Honolulu, April 24.—(By Associated Press)—Throughout last night searchlights stabbed the tropic sky over the island of Oahu, searching for planes of the blue fleet which is attacking the island in the war game now being held in the Pacific. There is tense feeling of suspense evident everywhere among the defending black forces as the impending invasion of the island drew one day nearer.

Persistent rumors that the blue attacking forces have established an aircraft base on the island of Kauai, with which communication has been cut off are evidently taken seriously by the defending black forces which kept the heavens illuminated throughout the night by searchlights in an effort to prevent night bombing of the island's defenses by a possible air raid of the invaders.

For the first time in history a major general commanding a beleaguered garrison last night broadcast his precarious position by radio to all America when Major General E. M. Lewis, commanding the Hawaiian department spoke over broadcasting station KGU. General Lewis told of his position and explained details of the war game but gave no details which might be of value to the attacking blues who were obviously listening.

SOVIET DENIES BULGARIAN PLOT

Moscow, April 24.—(By Associated Press)—Much resentment is manifest in the soviet press and government circles over statements circulated abroad fixing responsibility for the terrorism in Sofia upon Moscow.

The executive committee of the international communists commenting on the attack upon Premier Tankoff of Bulgaria for attributing bombing of the Sveti Kralchevski to its organization says: "Falsification and blackmail are becoming more and more the chief weapons of the adversaries of the comintern (communist international). For months our enemies have been forging letters, orders and decisions and other documents purporting to be signed by the executive of the comintern. The Tankoff fascist government, has accepted all records in this respect."

After declaring the comintern opposed to purely individual or localized terrorism, the statement gives vigorous denial to the Bulgarian allegations, saying responsibility for the events in Sofia "must be borne by Tankoff's bloody government itself."

OREGON HIGH SCHOOL TO GRADUATE 5257

Seniors in Oregon high schools who are expected to be graduated this year total 5257, of whom 2564 are boys and 2693 are girls, according to statistics made public by J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools.

Superintendent Churchill in commenting on the proportion of boys to girls in high schools, said that one of the measurements used by the Russell Sage foundation in determining the efficiency of a high school is the percentage of boys to girls. Under this measurement the Roseburg high school leads all districts of the first class, since 63 per cent of its graduates this year are boys. The school ranking next in the percentage of boys enrolled in the senior class are: Corvallis, 55 per cent; Pendleton, 54 per cent; Dallas, 52; Ashland, 51; Klamath Falls, 51.

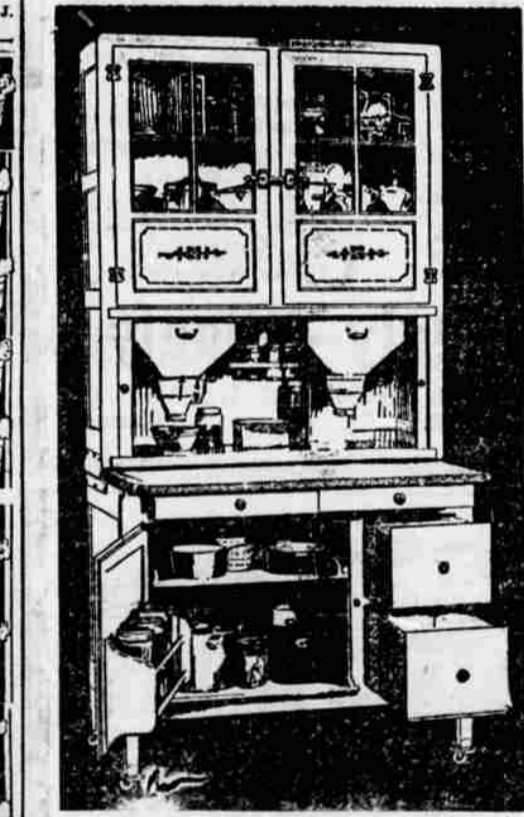

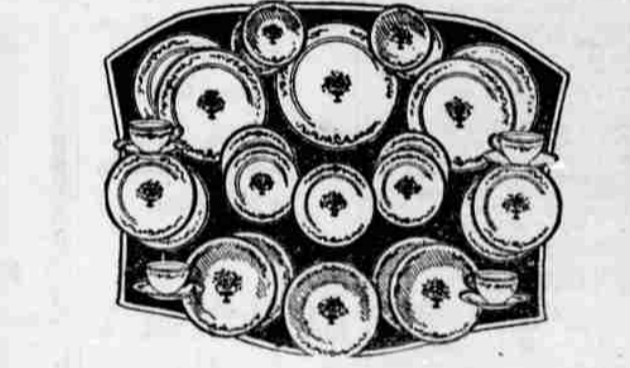

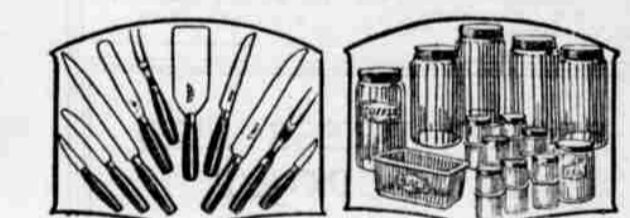
