

BOOZE VENTURE IS DISASTEROUS FOR SYNDICATE

London, April 28.—The Daily Mail which recently told of Sir Broderick Hartwell's misadventure in whiskey running off the American coast, now says he has circularized his supporters to the effect that he has "everything in the debacle."

Of the 61,000 cases in the shipment, the American authorities are declared to have seized more than 22,000. About 6000 were sold and the proceeds spent on venereal, coal and other things. Thirty-two thousand cases remain available for sale, the circular says, but it is problematical whether they can be disposed of, the risk of seizures being great.

"It is obvious," Sir Broderick continues, "that a big loss of capital is inevitable and every contributor has the right to sue me for non-fulfillment of my guarantee, but I have lost everything and any such action would only result in hampering my endeavors to save something from the wreck. And I am the only person who can do so."

MURDER OF GIRL STILL UNSOLVED

Gary, Ind., April 28.—A variety of theories in the guided police of two states in their efforts to identify the charred, bullet-riddled and dismembered body of a girl, found Sunday near Chesterton, Ind., and to find her slayer.

While the body lay in a Chesterton morgue early today, the undertaker received a telephone call purporting to come from Captain William Linn of the Gary police, saying he had information that the girl was "Grace Dixon of Gary." Captain Linn denied he had made such a call. Attempts to trace the call failed.

One tip to Chicago and Gary police said the girl may have been a woman who posed as the wife of a Chicago whiskey runner whose name was withheld. The woman had not been seen since Saturday. Lots of missing girls also were checked. The only tangible clues were a partly burned pair of eyeglasses, a string of beads, a powder box and a Pennsylvania railway employe's card.

SILVERTON RESIDENT FOR MANY YEARS DEAD

Silverton, O., April 28.—(Special.)—Tollie Anundson, aged 78 and a long time resident of Silverton, died at his country home on the Abiqua, Saturday morning. Funeral services will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Jack & Ekman mortuary. Interment will be made at the Evans Valley cemetery.

Mr. Anundson leaves a widow, nine children—Mrs. Frank Morley, George Anundson, Henry Anundson of Silverton, Albert Anundson and Mrs. Edna Turner of Portland, Mrs. Lulu Kason of Salem, Miss Nellie Anundson of Seattle, Raymond and Thoman Anundson of Comberg, Cal.—three brothers, one sister and three grandchildren.

New York, April 28.—Lady Astor, M. P., has been urged by her family to take a rest because of her health but she is opposed to quitting English politics until there are more women to carry on her work.

Mrs. Charles Dana Gibson, wife of the artist, and sister of England's woman member of parliament, who has just returned from abroad, today said Lady Astor's family has been begging her to consider her health.

"She is ready to get out," said Mrs. Gibson, "but the trouble is that the other women who are getting into politics don't stay there long enough to permit her to get out. When there are more women to do the work Lady Astor is trying to do she may quit politics."

HARVARD PAPER AGAIN OFFENDS

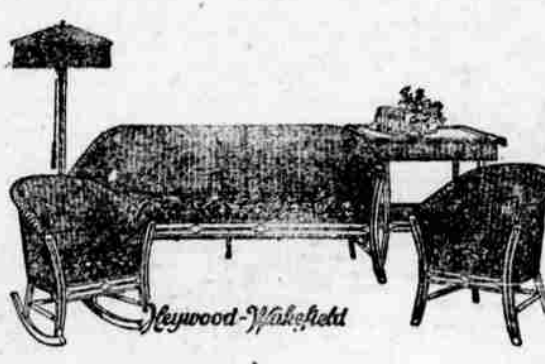
Cambridge, Mass., April 28.—While an expurgated edition of the Harvard Lampoon, student humorist publication, recently barred from the mails because of alleged indecent pictures, went on sale today, copies of the Harvard Advocate were being detained by Cambridge postal authorities pending a decision from Washington on one picture in the issue which they believed may be ruled indecent.

The current issue of the Advocate is a burlesque of the Dial. The picture to which the postal authorities' attention is drawn is entitled "neo-platonic love," depicting an embracing couple.

In the Lampoon issue which was withheld from the mails the authorities objected to the use of the American flag in a comic cover design showing Washington crossing the Delaware and to a picture of a nude woman.

Now the flag on the cover is white, and a white space has been ruled off on the body of the nude

woman in the following appears under the caption: "pursis omnia pura ad." "Part of this picture is omitted in this edition in deference to the tastes and prejudices of sundry nasty minded torquemadas and dogberry. Art lovers may see the original of the painting by Manet excellently reproduced among the university prints which are on sale at the Fogg art museum and the Harvard Cooperative Society."

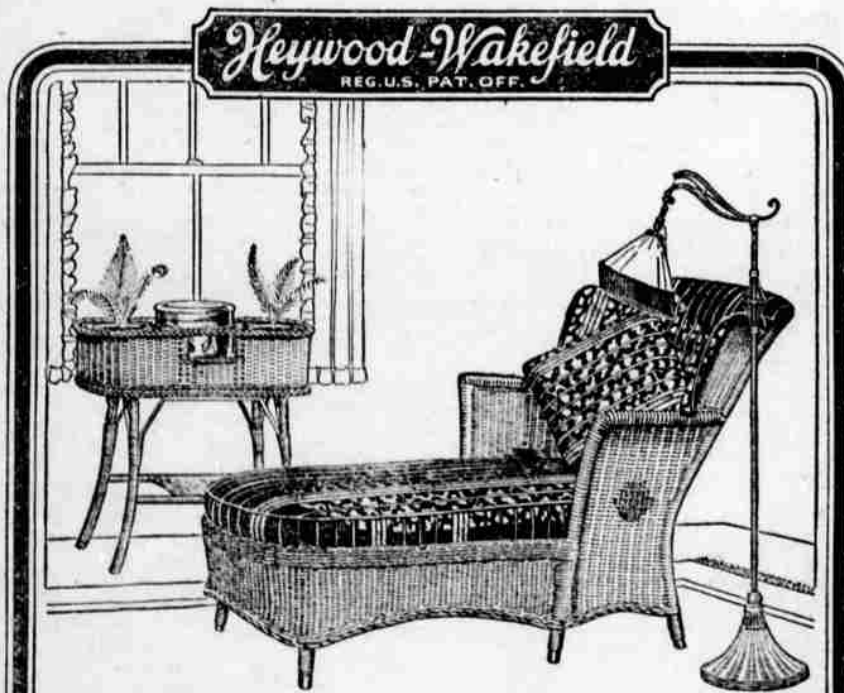

Berlin, April 28.—(By Associated Press.)—The communist organ Rote Fahne (red flag), today publishes an open letter to the trade union and socialist executives urging a 24-hour strike on the day of Field Marshal Von Hindenburg's entry into Berlin to assume the presidency to which he was elected Sunday.

Moscow, April 28.—News of the election of Field Marshal Von Hindenburg as president of Germany, was received with astonishment in soviet Russia, where people had been led to believe that the aged military leader had little chance of success. His triumph is especially unwelcome to the Russian communists, who know his avowed hostility to bolshevism.

Some soviet leaders believe that after a few months in office Von Hindenburg may attempt to have the former crown prince appointed regent with the ultimate object of completely restoring the German crown.
