

MANEUVERS ARE LOOKED UPON AS BIG NAVY ASSET

Washington, April 22.—Lessons of vast importance in national defense and perhaps a recommendation to congress to strengthen the defenses of Hawaii, are expected to result from the fleet maneuvers concluded yesterday in the Pacific.

News of the landing at Oahu aroused intense interest at the navy department. Those naval experts who have contended that the defense should be more secure skilled knowledge at the result of the maneuvers.

The maneuvers about Hawaii were concentrated on Oahu on the theory that if it were captured, control of the other islands in the group by an attacking force would be a natural sequel.

News dispatches as the result of the attack were far ahead of official advice. When Admiral Eberle, the chief of operations, reached his office today, not even a preliminary report from Hawaii had been received.

ESKIMO RESERVATION IN ARCTIC IS PLANNED

Ottawa, Ont., April 22.—The establishment of a reservation for the eskimos of the Canadian Arctic is a step toward alleviating rigorous conditions under which many bands now live, was recommended today by Dr. Knut Rasmussen, Arctic explorer, who is here to consult the Canadian government about results in the far north. He said he believed the government was ready to take such steps.

Dr. Rasmussen, who recently made a long journey into the eskimo territory to investigate stories of starvation conditions, which, it was reported, were leading eskimos to kill girl babies because food was insufficient, was reticent about results of his expedition.

INDIAN GOVERNMENT TO ASSIST ROOSEVELT

Simla, India, April 22.—(By Associated Press.)—The India government has completed arrangements to assist Theodore Roosevelt on his expedition into central Asia. It was announced today. The party is expected to reach Bombay about May 8, coming from Marselles.

COULTER SAYS EVOLUTION IS NOT GUESS WORK

Chicago, April 22.—One of the curious facts in reference to the current popular discussion of evolution, Professor John M. Coulter of the University of Chicago told the congress of the Disciples of Christ today in the confusion of evolution with Darwinism.

As the result of demonstrations made well after Darwin's time, Dr. Coulter declared, "there is no longer any question as to the fact of evolution."

"Darwin's explanation," he said, "is simply one of a number of explanations, most of which have been proposed since Darwin's time. In his time the method of study was observation and inference. Of course inference is not demonstration."

VON HINDENBURG FACES PROBLEM OF WHAT TO WEAR

Berlin, April 22.—(By Associated Press.)—Germany's new president not only has the care of office to face in the near future, but one problem of an apparently minor nature which is his inauguration. This is the delicate problem of how he shall attire himself for the ceremonial.

As head of the nation, Hindenburg also is commander in chief of the army and it is planned to have him review a military parade immediately after the ceremony in the reichstag. When heretofore a president has reviewed the troops he has done so in civilian attire, but Hindenburg besides being a civilian is a retired field marshal general and entitled to wear a uniform.

According to the military etiquette under which the president-elect grew up, it is regarded as an insult if a military man visits the troops in civilian dress. On the other hand, if he appears in uniform before the reichstag it is considered certain he will give offense to that body. The president-elect thus seems to be facing a real dilemma.

FLAX GROWERS URGE NO LINSEED TARIFF CHANGE

Washington, April 22.—A recommendation of the tariff commission for reduction in the duty on linseed oil was referred today by President Coolidge to the department of agriculture which will report on the effect on growers of flax and on agriculture generally.

The commission's recommendation is understood to have been unanimous. Representatives of northwest states in which flax is grown recently appealed to the president against a change.

HARTLEY TELLS VETO REASONS

Olympia, Wash., April 22.—Declaring that the proposed development of the Kittitas irrigation project under the terms of the contract submitted by the federal government involved a policy rather than a project, Governor Hartley issued a supplemental statement here today to the one issued last Friday, when the director of conservation and development was requested to return the contract unassigned.

Governor Hartley declared that section 6 of the proposed contract adequately binds the state to assume full responsibility for the settlement of all the 70,000 acres in the project, including providing of dwelling and other buildings, fencing and flumes. He said the same policy might eventually involve financing the settlement of more than 3,000,000 acres of undeveloped land in the state.
