In their half of the second canto the locals got their first three tallies when Heenan came out of his slump a 2 got a hit the first one for the locals. Kelly walked and advanced Heenan to second. Febray, who was playing in right field, got a home run over the right field fence scoring Heenan and Kelly ahead of him. Rogers fanned, but Ellis got to first on Riley's error. CHILD WELFARE STAND TAKEN BY HARTLEY ECHOED

Olympia, Wash., May 8.—Letter approving Governor Roland H. Hartley's stand on child welfare activities as set forth in a recent telegram to Miss Sophie Irene Leeb of New York City, president of the Child Welfare Committee of America, were exhibited at the executive offices here this morning, the letters with one exception have been written by men. No adverse comments have been received as yet, it was said by Miss Amy Albright, assistant secretary to the governor, who displayed the letters in his absence.

Appended to one of the letters, in which such movements were declared to be founded on "amateur purposes" the following notation was penciled by Governor Hartley:

"It is 'amateur' Russian communism, socialism and anarchy are moving spirits back of all these movements intended to break down our civilization."

One of the writers characterized the governor's statement as "truly Rooseveltian," another expressed approval of the "slipper way" of raising children, while still another writer declared that "uplift is being used by some as an
