

TOBIN TO FACE FRAUD COUNT IN FEDERAL COURT

The federal grand jury in Portland has returned indictments against Edward J. Tobin and his brother Alex J. Tobin charging them with fraud in connection with obtaining and forging a government pension check for \$15.

The two brothers were taken from here to Portland. The pension check in question was issued to a patient at the Oregon State hospital where Edward J. Tobin was employed as an attendant. It was charged he filched the check from the patient's mail, turned it over to his brother, who cashed it in a local store.

Before the brothers were charged with the check fraud, Edward J. Tobin was arrested by county officers charged with aiding a patient to escape from the hospital. When federal officers wanted him he was released here before tried on that charge.

TWILIGHT BALL TO START TODAY

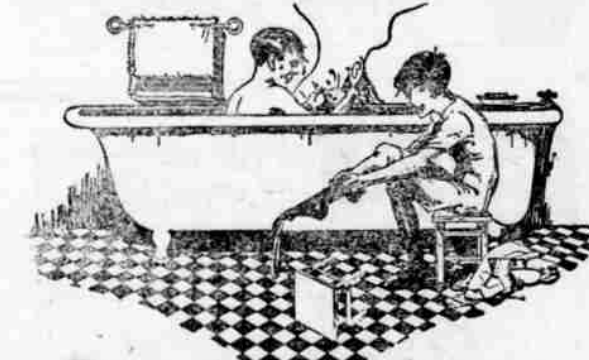
