

### SANITARY RULES FOR AUTO CAMPS PROMULGATED

Under an act of the 1925 legislature the state board of health, at a meeting here Saturday, promulgated rules and regulations to govern the maintenance of camp grounds in the state, whether public or privately operated. The rules are not effective until January 1, 1926.

As to the size of the grounds the rules provide that the usable space must be at least 350 feet square and the strictest sanitation will be required, including depots for garbage and rubbish that are fly-proof. These will not be permitted to become unsightly or foul smelling. A thoroughly sanitary water supply will be another requirement. The strictest care must be taken by campers to prevent fires. Camp fires must not be located so as to endanger automobiles or buildings.

Among the rules are the following pertaining to buildings and grounds:

No room used for sleeping purposes shall have less than 500 cubic feet of air space for each occupant.

The area of window space in each sleeping room shall be equal to at least one-eighth of the floor area of the room.

Cooking shall not be permitted in any sleeping room.

If kitchen is provided it must be equipped with running water and a sink connected with a sewerage system, septic tank or covered cesspool.

Bath and lavatory and toilet must be connected with sewerage system, septic tank or covered cesspool.

It shall be the duty of all camp ground managers to report to the local health officers all persons suspected of having contagious diseases.

Authority for a state-wide milk survey in co-operation with the dairy and food commission was given by the board, and also authority was given for the broadcasting of health news. The cause and control of common colds is to be investigated and a report published.

### First Band Concert Of Season to Be Held Late In June, Report

The Salem Cherrian band is rapidly rounding into shape and will give its first public concert in Willson park during the last week in June, it was stated today by Oscar Steelhammer, director of the band. It has been practicing for two months.

The band will consist of 26 pieces this year, an increase of six over last year. Total sum of \$1500, allowed by the city council to pay expenses for 13 public concerts during the summer, will not be enough for a band the size of the present one, and the deficit will be made up by issuing an official program for each concert, according to Steelhammer. Programs will be distributed free of charge, profit being derived from the advertising. In previous years they have been handled on a private basis.

"This summer is going to be the biggest season for tourists Salem has ever had, and we want to put up the best front we possibly can," says Steelhammer. "That's the reason we're doing everything we can to produce the best band Salem has ever had."

Two concerts a week for nine weeks will be given, the same as in former years. Steelhammer has counted that there will be 65 different conventions on the Pacific coast during the coming summer, including a

### \$200 IN PRIZES TO BE AWARDED FOR BEST ESSAYS

University of Oregon, Eugene, May 11.—(Special)—Two hundred dollars in cash prizes will be offered for the best essays written by high school and grade school students in the prize essay contest to be conducted between now and September 15 by the all-Oregon 1925 exposition committee, according to an announcement made today.

Contestants will write on one of two general subjects: (1) Oregon-made products; or (2) the educational and cultural values of art. These subjects were deemed appropriate inasmuch as the all-Oregon 1925 exposition, to be held in Portland, October 5 to 10 inclusive, will feature Oregon-made goods. The exposition itself is planned to promote the case of art in Oregon.

The state prizes are as follows: The high school contest—\$50 for first place; \$30 for second prize, and \$20 for third place. Grade school contest—\$50 for first place; \$30 for second place, and \$20 for third place.

The all-Oregon 1925 exposition committee, which offers the awards, will make an effort to offer prizes for the best essays written in each county, but no announcement will be made on this plan as yet.

Essays must be confined in a general way to the two subjects mentioned above: (1) Oregon-made products, or (2) the educational and cultural values of art.

but the contestant may choose his own title and, of course, his subject matter so long as they fall within one of the two headings mentioned. The committee suggests the following titles as an example of what is desired, but the contestant is not necessarily restricted to those titles, as has been stated. In fact, an original and striking title, provided it falls within one of the two general heads, may be one of the factors in weighing the merit of an essay.

Essays must be written legibly in ink or (preferably) typewritten, double-spaced, and have wide margins. The size of paper should be 8 1/2 x 11 inches. The contestant should write on one side of the paper only.

Essays must not exceed 800 words. Any exceeding 800 words will not be considered by the judges of the contest.

All direct quotations in essays must be enclosed in quotation marks.

The essays must be in the hands of the secretary of the all-Oregon 1925 exposition committee, 651 court house, Portland, Or., not later than September 15.

The contest judges are: Judge Charles H. Carey, former president of the Oregon Writers' League and author and historian; Anthony Euwer, poet and illustrator, and Dean Eric W. Allen, of the University of Oregon school of journalism.
