

RUSE WORKED TO GET SIGNERS ON BUS PETITIONS

Albany, Or., May 14.—Reports were current in Albany that a woman is here circulating petitions referring the proposed automobile bus regulatory and licensing law to the people, making false statements for the purpose of securing signatures.

According to the reports the woman approaches a prospective signer with some such question as: "Do you want to put the auto business out of business?" When the affirmative answer is given, it is said, the woman says, "Well, sign this petition," explaining that the petition would give the people a chance to pass such a law.

As a matter of fact, it was explained, the law is actually on the statute books and will be effective May 23. The petitions are designed to suspend the law by invoking the referendum. If the petitions are sufficiently supplied with signatures the law will be inoperative until the next election, a year and a half from now.

Accordingly those who sign with the expectation of placing a just tax on the automobile buses and commercial trucks are defeating their own purpose by signing the petitions.

occurred May 7, it was not announced to the public by the soviet press until today. Savinkoff was serving a long prison term for counter revolution. After turning informer for the state he was accorded many privileges in the Moscow prison not enjoyed by other prisoners and it was believed he "as a content with his lot as a man could be, under the circumstances."

In the only interview he granted while in prison, Savinkoff told the Associated Press correspondent a few months ago that the prison officials were exceptionally kind to him and that he was reconciled to his fate. He said he would devote his time in jail to writing fiction, but after his release would concentrate himself to the interests of the Russian people. He then was living in a comfortable room in the Moscow political prison which had none the aspects of a cell.
