students always has been and will continue to be the chief concern of the university, and his concern is shared by the student body, in which a large part of the responsibility for student department is necessarily and confidently placed."

The resolution came as a direct result of a petition circulated by J. J. Nunn, member of the Presbyterian church of Salem, and a series of petitions circulated by the students of the university.
