

WOMAN SHOT AND LEFT IN BURNING HOUSE ESCAPES

Winthrop, Maine, May 20.—A posse of county officers reinforced by citizens was searching the countryside near Lake Maranacook today for a man who is believed to have shot and seriously wounded Mrs. Emma M. Towns and then set fire to her cottage. Miss Aida Hayward, a niece of Mrs. Towns, is missing and believed to have been abducted.

Mrs. Towns and her niece are among the most respected citizens of the town.

According to the story told by Mrs. Towns she and her niece returned last night from Winthrop village to the cottage on the east shore of Lake Maranacook and as they entered the door two shots were fired from within. Both bullets struck Mrs. Towns.

WOMAN FREED BY GOVERNOR PIERCE

Reichstag Supported
Berlin, May 20.—(A. P.)—The government today received a vote of confidence in the reichstag. The vote was 214 to 129 with 25 not voting.

Governor Pierce has extended executive clemency to Mrs. Sarah Florence Johnson, Portland woman who was sentenced to prison and fined \$250 for a violation of the prohibition law. An executive order freeing her and remitting her fine was forwarded by the governor yesterday to District Judge Mears in Portland. She already has served 30 days in jail.

Judge Mears was of the opinion that the woman was the victim of circumstances to a considerable extent. It is said she was a hard working woman and has a daughter 10 years old to support.

County prosecuting attorneys of Washington are planning a statewide fight against indecent publications and have called a meeting for Friday at Tacoma to discuss the situation.
