

### CHAUTAUQUA IN SALEM IS DATED FOR JULY 9 TO 17

Salem Chautauqua will hold forth July 9 to 17. The first meeting of the local guarantors is called at the Chamber of Commerce for 8 o'clock p. m. sharp on Tuesday evening, June 2.

Twenty-seven men and one woman of Salem sponsor this attraction this year and are behind a contract guaranteeing a minimum net patronage of \$1950 on opening night.

These guarantors reap no personal gain whatsoever aside from the satisfaction of rendering a service to the community in bringing this usually excellent season of education and high-class entertainment to the city at a cost of about one-fourth the price of usual single admissions.

The big Chautauqua tent will occupy its old stand on the campus of Willamette University where for over ten years in unbroken succession it has stood.

Season tickets this year will be at the old original prices of \$2.50 for adults, \$1.50 for students and \$1.00 for children. Tickets will be on sale early at the usual places about the city.

Last year Salem stood highest in the Edison-White circuit in the extent of ticket sales and in view of the strong program announced, which will be featured from time to time in the local press, the guarantors advise that season tickets be secured early and that the patrons be at the big tent in ample time each evening as seats will doubtless be at a premium from the start.

### PRECIOUS STONES ARE STOLEN FROM MUSEUM

Detroit, Mich., May 29.—Precious stones of an unestimated value have been stolen from the Detroit Institute of Arts, it became known last night when police admitted detectives were working on the case and gave out a list of more than 39 emeralds, diamonds, rubies and oriental sapphires, singly and in groups, which were missing.

The jewels were taken from the children's section of the collection of the late Frank B. Stearns, wealthy drug manufacturer and replaced with plaster parts.

### EUGENE BUILDING FOR 5 MONTHS SETS RECORD

Eugene, Or., May 29.—Building permits for the first five months of the present year in Eugene reached \$1,159,355 with the announcement today that the May new construction work totalled \$269,000. This is a record for the city. The reports for January show \$169,400; February \$300,525; March \$185,459; April \$292,300.

### SETTLEMENT OF WAR DEBTS NEAR SOLUTION NOW

Washington, May 29.—(A. P.)—Progress toward clarification of the war debt question continues at a steady pace with significant developments here and abroad. With indications in Washington that Italy advancing step by step, is nearing a basis for formal negotiations for settlement, overnight dispatches from Paris quoting Adolph S. Ochs, purchaser of the New York Times declared headway is being made toward solution of France's debt payment.

Mr. Ochs, who said he "spoke upon the highest authority," disclaimed the role of "even an unofficial observer" but added that he could properly deny that impulsive or disagreeable messages had been exchanged between Paris and Washington concerning the debt.

Another meeting between Italian Ambassador DeMartino and treasury officials is in prospect here when the baron receives from Rome information concerning his country's finances, for which he cabled yesterday. The talks thus far are said to have revealed that Italy's capacity to pay will provide the basis for its settlement.
