MOTORS ON SHIPS WILL PREVAIL, REPORT SAYS
London—A big "sea change"—steamships to motor-ships—is predicted in the annual report of Harland and Wolff, the big ship-building firm. The company, which has 13 motorships under construction, including three liners of over 20,000 tons reports that, judging from present indications, "the motorship will supersede the steamship in much the same way as in the course of the last century the steamship superseded the sailing ship."

AMBASSADORS SEND PROTEST NOTE TO BERLIN

Paris, May 30.—(A.P.)—The council of ambassadors today approved and signed a note to Germany regarding her disarmament under the Treaty of Versailles. The note will be presented to Berlin on Tuesday or Wednesday.

The council of ambassadors will mail the note to Berlin tomorrow. It will arrive on Tuesday and be presented to the Berlin government by the allied envoys as soon as convenient. It will be published Wednesday afternoon.

The details of Germany's alleged failure to disarm as stipulated by the Versailles treaty are outlined in the document which consists of forty-four pages including annexes. Twenty-four hours after the note should be delivered in Berlin a complete report of the inter-allied military control commission will be published.

The note says the evacuation of the Cologne area depends upon the fulfillment of the Versailles treaty obligations and states that although reparations are being paid, disarmament provisions of the treaty have been violated.

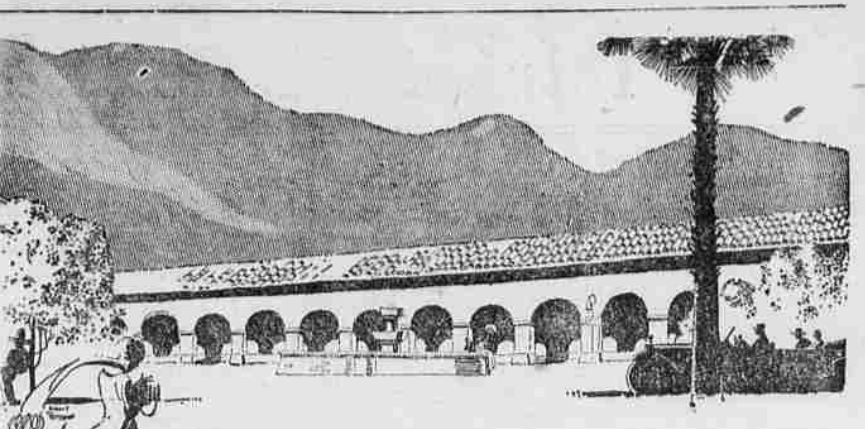
