

OLD POTATOES SCARCER; PRICE ADVANCE PENDING

Portland, Ore., June 2.—Last season's potatoes are becoming scarce. In Portland approximately ten tons of Oregon grown and twenty-five to thirty tons of Yakima Valley product are in storage. This is less than two weeks supply for this city. Oregon potatoes are out of growers' hands and are under command of wholesalers.
