2000 Members Added To Grange In 2 Years State Master Claims

Dallas, Ore., June 3.—An expansion of Grange activities in Oregon, especially in the eastern Oregon district, has given the organization a net gain of 2,000 new members in two years and 250 new subordinate granges in the past year as indicated in the annual report of State Master Palmer and other officers in the opening session of the 1925 Oregon State Grange in Dallas Tuesday.

The report of the state officers formed the principal order of business on the opening day.

Attendance Heavy
The registration show from 249 delegates at the morning session to 284 at the afternoon session with a total attendance of from 600 to 700. It is expected that a maximum attendance of 1200 may be reached if fair weather prevails later in the week. A heavy rainfall, which began during the night, continued throughout the most of the day Tuesday and gave the visitors plenty of western Oregon moisture.

State Master Palmer, in an annual address and report covering 28 pages of typewritten copy, took up in turn the important matters with which the grange is concerned.

He focused a severe attack on the Dennis resolution and the present method of organizing the legislature through the pledging of votes for the speakership and president of the senate before the body convenes.

In discussing the Dennis resolution, Mr. Palmer stated that an organization should be made to fight it, and at the same time to initiate a new income tax measure to go along the same ballot. He declared that while the Dennis resolution was being taken by many as a joke it was a serious matter. In doing away with inheritance taxes it would cost \$400,000 to \$600,000 of the state's yearly revenue, while on the face it would be made to look attractive. He placed particular stress on the expenditure of \$53,000 to secure the repeal of the 1923 income tax. "This should teach us that the future we will have to put up money to carry on our campaign, the same as those who oppose us. They will contribute large sums to get what they want, and we must do the same or quit," Mr. Palmer stated.

In its legislative activity, Mr. Palmer urged that the grange use every care in not recommending or endorsing too many measures, as it was difficult to carry out such a program, but asked that every subordinate grange should have an active legislative committee to investigate proposed measures. The matter of preferential assignments and other internal policies now used in securing the speakership of the house and presidency of the senate drew his full attention.
