

### BRYAN SAYS HE WILL RETIRE TO WRITE MEMOIRS

Chicago, June 5.—William Jennings Bryan's "swan song" of oratory probably will be heard at the Tennessee evolution trial at Dayton, July 10.

The great commoner announced at Springfield, Ill., that he intended to retire from the lecture platform to devote his time to writing his memoirs.

Mr. Bryan made only a brief reference to the coming evolution fight in a speech yesterday at Jacksonville, Ill., his former home, before continuing to Nashville, Tenn., where he will be joined by counsel for the prosecution of J. Scopes, indicted Dayton school teacher.

Speaking to old friends and neighbors at a celebration of the city's centenary, Mr. Bryan mentioned the recent decision of the supreme court in the Oregon school case, indicating that it was significant of what might be expected in the Tennessee trial. He said the decision gave the rights to safeguard the religion of the child, and also affirmed the right of the state to regulate the schools and what shall be taught in the schools.

### COACH PROBLEM AT HIGH SCHOOL YET UNSETTLED

More complications have arisen in the controversy over the paying of the athletic coach of the Salem high school, with the announcement by the student council of the withdrawal of the \$500 appropriated for the construction of a new athletic field, east of the Parlier junior high school, and applying it towards the salary of the coach.

With the withdrawal of the money from the fund for the new field leaves that proposition in the air as to whether or not the local high school will have a new field. Another angle of the case, developed also when the student council only appropriated \$500. Heretofore, Hollis Huntington, coach for the Salem high school, has received \$1150 for his services—the students paying \$500 and the board \$500. The board's \$500 and a like amount from the students would leave the students \$150 short for their amount. The students made no provision for the added sum, merely retracting the athletic field fund of \$500 and turning it over. They are of the opinion that the \$150 will not be appropriated, although nothing is definite.

Huntington will not accept this plan as he thinks that he is worth the sum he is now receiving and will accept no out. He claims that he is working for as small amount as he possibly can and will be willing to continue if he receives the same salary as he has been. "I don't want to seem unreasonable," said Huntington yesterday after selling stock in the sum of \$150,000.

Mme. The senator had an appointment at Junction City to speak against his campaign for governor, and had to hurry on. After reaching Junction City he wired Lachmund, who is a dealer in hops, prunes, peaches, etc., and a friend of Hall, asking him to appear in court in his behalf. Were it not for advertising it might be stated that Louis got Hall off without a fine. Today Police Judge Poulson received a letter from Hall begging pardon for not appearing in person and expressing a profound and abiding faith in Lachmund's ability to handle the case with credit.

### STATE MOVES TO TEST OUT TITLE TO SAND ISLAND

That the question of whether the state of Oregon or the federal government is the rightful owner of Sand Island, in the mouth of the Columbia river, will be determined in court became certain Wednesday when the state land board granted to the Columbia River Fishers' association a lease to the fishing rights of the island. The state is to receive 50 per cent of the proceeds of the fishing operations.

Since 1854 the federal government has had control of the island and has leased out the fishing rights. In that year the state ceded the island to the government, the terms being that it be used for military purposes. It never was used for military purposes, hence the state's claim that title should now revert to the state. 
