San Francisco, June 11.—Far out on the deep blue of the Pacific, four trim canvas propelled yachts are today well underway to the distant island of Tahiti in the longest sporting boat race ever attempted. Before night falls the craft should have completed about 135 miles of the 3655 mile trek to the far away goal. With some 19 days ahead of them the four sturdy sea-going mariners will for considerable stretches of time have virtually the whole of the Pacific to themselves, as their course does not follow the lanes of steamer travel. 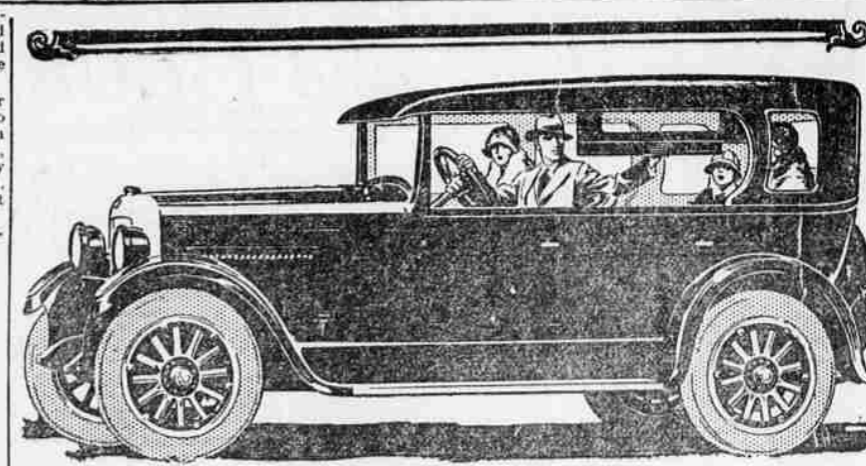
