LONG LOST WITNESS IN TRIAL FOUND

Robert White, Missing Witness in Shepherd Case Walks Into Court Room This Morning.

Chicago, June 12.—Robert White, long missing witness in the Shepherd trial, unexpectedly walked into the court room this morning and reported to Joseph Savage, assistant state's attorney. "Here I am, Mr. Savage," said White, who immediately was rushed to the office of the state's attorney. He led his wife and two children into the courtroom. "I am here to fight this thing to a finish; there is more to it than you know," Savage said White had stated, as the doors were closed and a conference began.

Lived In Seclusion

After he had questioned White, Savage said White virtually had repeated charges he made in letters against W. W. O'Brien of Shepherd's defense and Arthur E. Brynes, investigator for O'Brien, and that he had fabricated an affidavit he made to O'Brien while in fear of his life.

No Poison Revealed

No poison was revealed in the youth's viscera, the doctor testified, although tests were made for virtually every known poison.
