

### TROOPS SENT TO COAL FIELDS CAPE BRETON

Halifax, N. S., June 12.—(A. P.)—Five hundred troops were on their way today for duty in the Cape Breton coal fields as the result of armed clashes between striking coal miners and British Empire Steel corporation police at New Waterford. These clashes yesterday resulted in the death of one miner, the serious wounding of another and injuries to two more. Fresh disorders were reported early today in New Aberdeen, a suburb of Glace Bay.

It was reported that the company's food shops at mines 12 and 14 had been cleaned out by a mob of miners. It was also reported, although confirmation was lacking, that the warehouse at number 14 and the offices at numbers 15 and 12 were ablaze with no water available.

In clashes yesterday for possession of the New Waterford power house several hundred rounds of ammunition were fired. After the fighting, police took refuge in the jail at New Waterford and reports of plans of miners to raid it were heard.

The power plant was captured from miner pickets by a surprise attack at dawn and recaptured by the miners at noon. William Davie, a miner and father of nine children, was killed and Gilbert Watson seriously wounded.

The power plant is the strategic point of the colliery system. A large detail of provincial police departed for Sydney on a regular train several hours before the troop trains left Halifax.

### GEISY URGED DRAINAGE DISTRICT IN SOUTHEAST

Mayor Geisy held a conference with members of the county court today urging that action be taken in the matter of the application for establishment of a drainage district in the southeastern part of the city and on contiguous lands. The court has had the matter under advisement since early in the year. Members of the court expressed the belief today that some definite action would be taken in the matter in the next few days.

### WHITE ARRIVES IN COMMAND OF OREGON MILITIA

Medford, June 12.—With eight special trains arriving at frequent intervals the Southern Pacific station swarming with khaki-clad soldiers, and the streets crowded with ammunition and equipment trucks, Medford took on the appearance today of an armed camp in wartime, with the opening of the state encampment of the Oregon national guard at Camp Jackson, a few miles north of the city. According to officers in charge, the encampment of nearly 2500 guardsmen is being carried out approximately on scheduled time, and by tomorrow everything should be in readiness to start the two weeks program of intensive training.

Mayor Allenderfer of Medford will deliver an address of welcome today to the state guardsmen on behalf of the citizens of Medford. Last to arrive on train number 8, were the 116th engineer company, Portland; Company H, 152 infantry, Portland; Company K of Tillamook, an dthe newly formed unit, Company C, from Grants Pass.

General George A. White, commanding officer of the encampment, has established brigade headquarters on a knoll overlooking the entire military reservation, where he can maintain a personal supervision over the troops which under his direction as adjutant general, have won their way to the first place among the national guard organizations of the United States.

The general and his staff officers will arrive shortly after noon and will proceed immediately to brigade headquarters, after being welcomed by a committee of Medford's leading citizens.

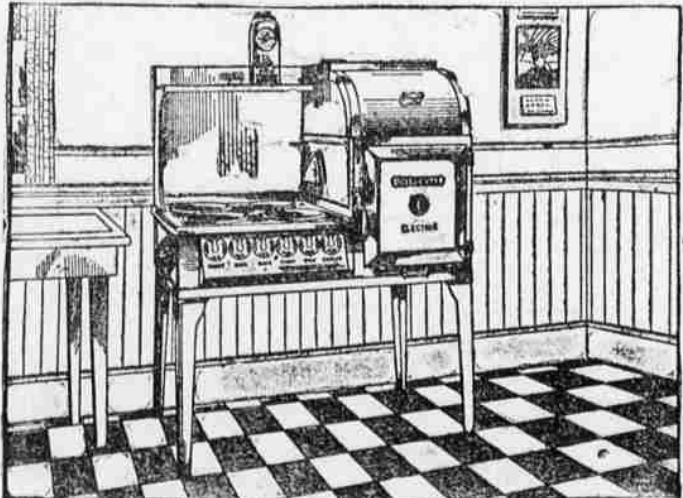
