

SENATORS MEET LUCKENBACHS AT SALEM SUNDAY

Tomorrow afternoon the Salem Senators will clash with the rejuvenated Luckenbach Sixty company nine on the Oxford park diamond. The Luckenbach nine got off to a bad start at the first of the season but have strengthened their club and have won the last four games against some of the strongest clubs in the league.

The game promises to be a hard fought battle as the Senators will be handicapped to a certain extent over the loss of two of their players who have left for other parts of the state. Bouton and Maple, shortstop and third baseman of the club, are leaving and it will be necessary for "Prisco" Edwards, manager of the club to shift Colman to third and a new player from the Oregon Agricultural college to short. Frank Rinehart will be sent in at left field. The club will not be weakened to any great extent it is thought as all of the new men are good and they might, if anything, strengthen the club.

The visitors have not met the locals as yet this season as the first meeting of the teams was postponed on account of rain. With the added strength of the shipbuilders it is thought that they may knock the league leading Senators off of their high perch. They will come down with two of the best hurlers in the league in Zwofel and Barlow. Edwards plans on starting Ashby for the local. This will make the second start for him this season. Ashby has words of stuff and will give the visitors all that he has.

The Vancouver club is out of the league and will be supplanted by Albany, who will accept the present standing of the Vancouver team at the bottom of the ladder with no wins. The new team has a strong aggregation and is merely joining to give the Albany fans better competition. They will meet Canas at Canas tomorrow and the papermakers and the Hillsboro nines will cross bats. Tomorrow's game will start promptly at 3 p. m.

Mrs. William D. Shepherd has joined her husband in the role of defendant in the "poison germ" prosecution resulting from the death of William McClintock, millionaire orphan of Chicago, who died under mysterious circumstances after bequeathing his fortune to the Shepherds, his foster parents. Mayor Hyman announced his candidacy for a third term as chief executive of New York City. Princess Mafalda, eldest unmarried daughter of the King of Italy, is engaged to Prince Philip of Hesse, her friends in Rome claim.

MYERS RESIGNS AS PROSECUTOR

Klamath Falls, Or., June 13.—Acting District Attorney W. P. Myers last night telegraphed his resignation to District Attorney William Ganong, who is ill in a veterans hospital at Walla Walla, Wash. The resignation followed a series of attacks on Myers by the Klamath Falls Evening Herald, which alleged irregularities in the prohibition fund as well as in other developments of his office. Myers has been in complete charge of the office for more than two months. Simultaneous with the resignation Myers announced he would start immediately civil libel proceedings against the Evening Herald.

District Attorney Ganong announced he will accept the resignation. He is expected to appoint Caleb Jones, who was recommended for the office several weeks ago by a group of local attorneys.

MUKDEN TROOPS REACH SHANGHAI

Shanghai, China, June 13.—Two thousand troops from the Mukden army of General Chang Tso-Lin, the Manchurian dictator, arrived in Shanghai this morning under the command of General Chang's son, Chang Hsueh-Liang. The troops were posted throughout the city and at the headquarters of the international settlement which was marked by Chinese flags. Strikes in the industrial plants which started spreading when news of the killing of eight Chinese students in a riot at Hankow was received here, continue to enlarge here today.

Hot weather with overcast skies prevailed today. It is unofficially reported the Peking government has decided to issue on Monday a mandate instructing Chinese provincial authorities to protect foreigners during the present disturbances throughout the country.

POSTAL PICNIC PLANNED SUNDAY FOR RICKREALL

Rickreall, June 13.—Some 200 people, postal employees with their wives, families and friends are expected here tomorrow from all parts of the Willamette valley as far south as Eugene and as far north as Oregon City. The time for assembling has been set at 10:30. Parties will meet in the Rickreall grove.

The postal employees at Salem are responsible for the picnic, having sent out invitations to the other postoffice groups. The Salem employees have staged a picnic annually for a number of years, last year going to Taylor's grove near Mehama. Tomorrow's picnic will be the first one where an attempt is made to bring together postal employees of more than one city. If successful it is planned to make the gathering an annual affair.

Musical numbers, sports, and activities of various kinds will mark the day's program. There will be foot racing, horse races, a nail driving contest for women and a needle threading contest for men. Prizes will be offered in many of the events.

The Eugene aggregation has challenged Salem to a game of baseball, the challenge has been accepted and a hot contest is expected to develop. Reports from Salem indicate that the postoffice team there played the P. O. P. company team last night, losing to them. The game was played on the Willamette field.

The city of Astoria has filed with the state engineering department an application for authority to appropriate water from Youngs river for the development of 200 horsepower, and for a municipal water supply, the estimated cost to be \$200,000. Other applications have been filed as follows:

Jesse E. Branch of Valley Falls, water from a spring for irrigation of one acre in Lake county.

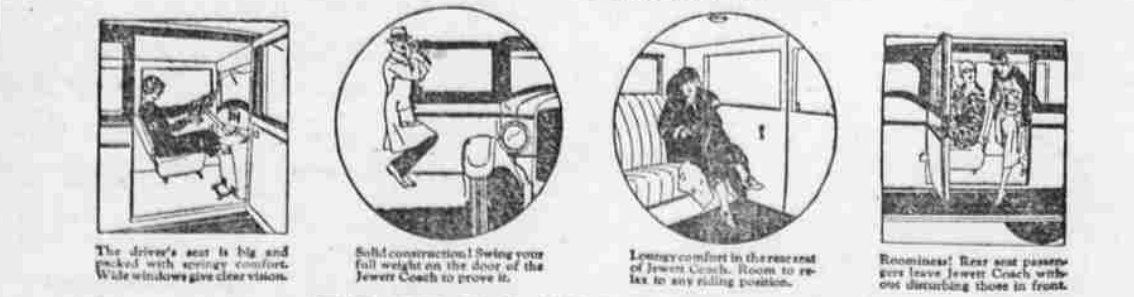
