BIDS ASKED ON HIGHWAY JOBS

At meetings of the state highway commission to be held in Portland, Thursday and Friday, June 25 and 26, bids will be opened for the improvement of a total of 125.46 miles of highway and for bridge construction in four counties. In addition bids will be opened for the construction of 21,500 feet of guard fence in Hood River and Wasco counties, and for a log building two stories high, 50 by 50 feet dimensions, plumbing, wiring, etc., for rest room and concession purposes at Emigrant Springs park on the Old Oregon Trail 27 miles southeast of Pendleton.

The road improvement project on which bids will be opened are:
Baker county—Middle bridge-Love bridges section of the Baker-Cornucopia highway, 3.8 miles of broken stone surfacing; Sag-Halt-way section of Baker-Cornucopia highway, 2.2 miles of crushed gravel surfacing.

Coos county—Coquille-Myrtle Point section of Coos Bay-Roseburg highway, 8.4 miles of resurfacing.
Josephine county—Redwood Junction-Well Ranch section of Oregon Caves highway, 4.32 miles of grading; O'Brien school-George Ranch section of Redwood highway, and Redwood Junction-Grayback Creek section of Oregon Caves highway, 20.42 miles of surfacing.

Klamath county—Deschutes county line-Creckett section of The Dalles-California highway, 13.38 miles of grading. Big Mountain-Beatty section of Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway, 13.45 miles of grading; Madras Point-Klamath Falls section of The Dalles-California highway, 18

miles of resurfacing.
Lane county—Albany-Lebanon section of the Santiam highway, 12.55 miles of grading and surfacing.
Tillamook county—Bay City section of Roosevelt Coast highway, .23 miles of grading.
Umatilla county—Emigrant Hill section of Old Oregon Trail, 18.7 miles of resurfacing.
The bridge projects will be as follows:
Curry county—Bridge over Chetoa river on Roosevelt Coast highway at Brookings.
Jefferson county—Bridge over Crooked river on The Dalles-California highway near Terrebonne.
Lane county—Retreatment above the site of the bridge over Willamette river at Harrisburg.
Union county—Bridge over the Grande Ronde river on the Allicol-Lower Cove market road.

CHINA PROTESTS KILLING TO BRITISH LEGATION

Peking, June 12—(By Associated Press)—The Chinese government today protested by note to the British legation the recent killings and wounding of Chinese at Hankow. The note emphasized the seriousness of the situation and reserved full liberty to demand compensation later.
The Chinese note requested the British legation to notify all British consulates to take measures to prevent recurrence of incidents such as took place at Hankow. In referring to the seriousness of the situation at Hankow the note pointed out that the Shanghai affair is still unsettled.

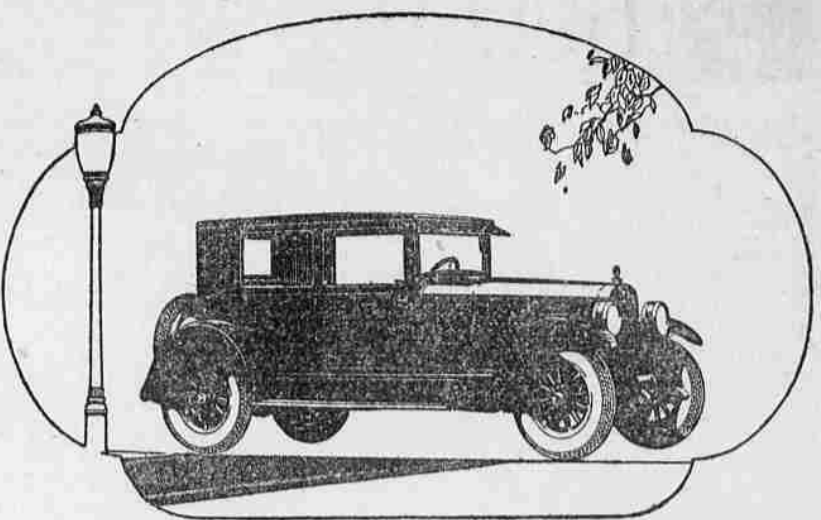

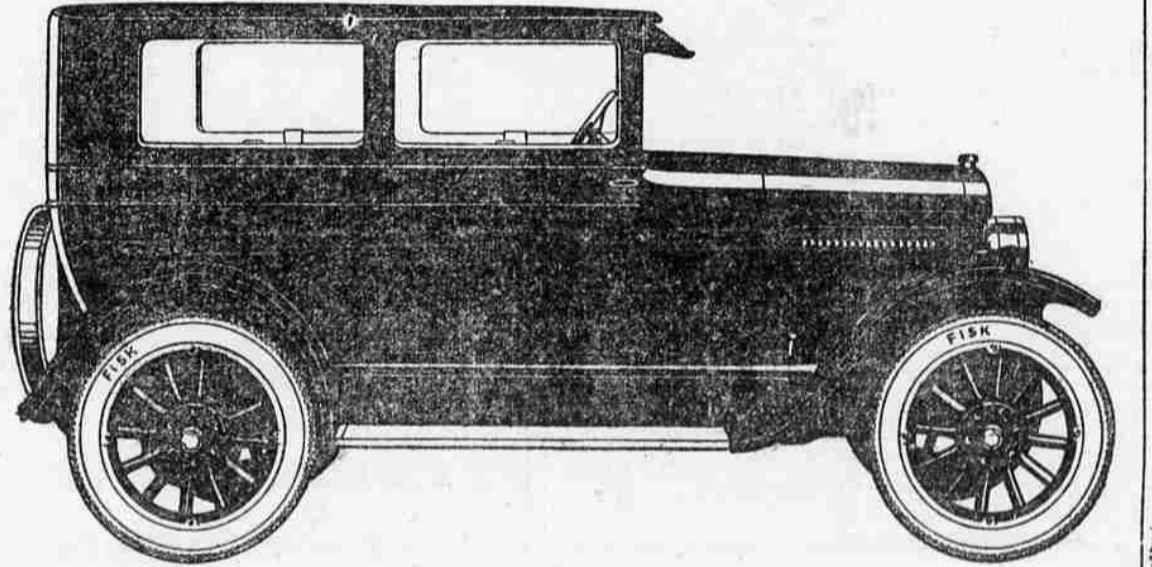
