

GENERAL STRIKE OF CHINESE SET TO OPEN JUNE 25

Canton, June 18.—(A. P.)—The threatened general strike of all Chinese workers today was set definitely to begin June 25.

The situation today, both as regards anti-foreign agitation and troubles among different factions of the Chinese, was quiet but foreigners expected further trouble. General Ngal Bong-ping, one of the leaders in the present Canton government, was said to have retired from active participation in its affairs because of a disagreement with his associates over allotment of government posts.

Proclamations were issued today forbidding gambling and trading in opium. The two occupations were observed continuing as usual, despite the proclamations. Troops in the army occupying Canton were requested to move beyond the city limits, in anticipation of orders.

COAST SCIENTISTS MEET IN PORTLAND

Portland, Or., June 18.—How science is helping in the solving of the forestry problems of the country formed the general subject discussed today at a meeting of the Pacific division of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, which is being held at Reed college here.

Among the speakers today were A. W. Cooper, Portland, secretary-manager of the Western Pine Manufacturers' association; Hugo Winkenwerder, dean of the college of forestry, University of Washington; C. G. Bales, director of the Rocky mountain experimental station, Colorado Springs, Colo.; E. P. Meinecke, forest pathologist, United States bureau of plant industry, San Francisco, and J. M. Swaine, Ottawa, Canada.

Dr. C. E. Grunsky of San Francisco, president of the Pacific division, will address a meeting tonight, his subject being the climate of the ice age.

SCOPES ASSERTS BELIEF IN BIBLE

Chattanooga, Tenn., June 17.—(A. P.)—"I am a Christian and believe the Bible is divinely inspired and that Jesus Christ did exist," said John T. Scopes, the Rhea county teacher, who is to be tried July 10 at Dayton on a charge of violating the law against the teaching of evolution in the county schools, in explaining his position to newspapers.

The professor added that he believed man was evolved from a lower order of animal and that the story of the creation as told in the Bible does not conflict with science pointing out when God said he created man in his own image and likeness, he did not say in what material form.

Speaking of the application made yesterday by Professor Scopes for his place back in Rhea county high school as science teacher, Superintendent Walter White

said he would not recommend any one as a teacher in the Rhea county schools who was not a fundamentalist.
