

OLSON ASSERTS ISABELLE POPE TO GET FORTUNE

Chicago, June 19.—Chief Justice Harry Olson, of the municipal court, who has seen the chief figure in the prosecution of William D. Shepherd, accused of causing the death of William N. McClintock, decreed today that regardless of the outcome of the Shepherd trial, Isabelle Pope, McClintock's fiancée, will come into possession of the McClintock fortune.

Judge Olson said Miss Pope eventually will be declared McClintock's lawful heir on the ground that Shepherd obstructed and held back the wedding contract.

"That wedding contract will be held binding, in my judgment," he said, "and when it is Isabelle Pope will receive all the personal property, one-half of the real estate and a life interest in the other half of the real estate. All except about \$200,000 of the estate will go to her. She will receive the full rights of a widow."

"It was out of the kindness of her heart that she gladly agreed to divide the estate with the other heirs."

EXTRADITION GRANTED FOR ROBBER OF BAND

Governor Pierce today granted an extradition on a requisition from the governor of Washington for the removal of Alvah R. Kilbourn from Portland to King county, Wash., to be tried for the robbery of the Bothell State bank.

Kilbourn, Joseph Pollock and George Jones robbed the bank on June 5. In fleeing from the scene of the robbery Pollock and Jones were both killed and Kilbourn was wounded in both arms. He made his way to Portland where he was arrested and is now confined in St. Vincent's hospital.

Collet Wins Again.

Versailles, June 19.—(A. P.)—Miss Glenna Collet of Providence, R. I., won the semi-final of the French women's golf championship today, defeating Mme. Vagliano, 7 up and 5 to play.

BLOCKADE LAID DOWN ON MOROCCAN COAST

Paris, June 19.—(A. P.)—A blockade of the Moroccan coast by French and Spanish warships to prevent arms and munitions reaching Abd-el-Krim, the warring leader of Moroccan tribesmen, became effective at 5 o'clock this morning. The French and Spanish governments reached an agreement last night regarding details.

There will be no supreme command, but the French and Spanish naval units participating in the blockade will take instructions from their respective admirals.

THYE DEFEATS EDWARDS

Portland, Or., June 19.—In his first match since his return from his Australian tour, Ted Thye, Portland light heavyweight wrestler, won two out of three falls here last night from Billy Edwards of Kansas City.

Thye took the first fall in 42 minutes with a combination wristlock and hammer lock. Edwards pinned his opponent for the second

fall in 10 minutes, 30 seconds with a headlock and Thye ended the match by taking the third fall in 9 minutes when he lifted Edwards high in the air and crashed him to the mat pinning his shoulders before he could recover his breath.

LAW TERMS SHATTERED BY POTENTIAL COPS

Colorado Springs, Colo., June 19.—The traditional terminology of law has been badly shattered by a group of applicants for the police department here.

Bigamy was construed as an assault on one or more members of one's family in one of the answers in the civil service examination for the posts.

Petty larceny was defined as the act of inducing a young girl to leave her home, while grand larceny was termed a tie in court.

Arson, a prospective "cop" said, was the act of stealing another man's wife, and a misdemeanor is to hit some one on the head with a club or blunt instrument.

Only three out of 15 applicants passed the examination.
