The Salem Senators baseball team defeated the Hillsboro nine on the Hillsboro diamond yesterday afternoon in the interstate league series by a score of 10 to 4. The locals were behind during the first few innings of the game but the locals tightened up and overcame the lead.

Hillsboro scored one run in the first when C. Henderson got a double against the fence on the first pitched ball. Cole went out. Proctor to Keene, Henderson going to third G. Henderson drew Proctor out of balance at first when Proctor threw to the plate and both runners were safe.

Hillsboro also scored one run in the second inning. Burkhalter went out. Bouton to Marple. Kreitz got a home run over the left field fence. Tuerck and C. Henderson were easy victims.

The locals tied the count at 2-all in their half of the third. Proctor first man up was robbed of a hit down the third base line and was thrown out at first. Marple singled. Steers was hit by a pitched ball for the second time, Marple being advanced to second. Keene was safe on a fielders choice while Cole threw Steers out at second. Rinehart singled and Marple tallied. Barr hit the ball against the left field fence for a double and Keene scored. Rinehart going to third. "Frisco" Edwards was robbed of a hit over first base when Burkhalter made a one handed catch for the third out.

In their half of the third the Hillsboro team scored another run to give them the lead again. Cole got a hit. G. Henderson hit the ball to deep right and Cole was caught at the plate. Henderson stopping at third. Barham had Wes Schulmerich struck out but the umpire called it a ball and he got a sacrifice fly into right field and Henderson scored.

Stoutenberg relieved Bill Tuerck in the third frame for the Hillsboro nine. The locals took the lead in their half of the fourth when they scored four runs. Bouton got his second walk of the game. Proctor hit a homer over the left field fence scoring Bouton ahead of

him. Marple got a two base hit. Steers got a walk. Marple went to third on a passed ball and Steers at the second. Bouton scored on a passed ball and Steers went to third. Keene sent a sacrifice fly to center and Steers scored. The Hillsboro team was unable to score any more until the seventh inning. The locals kept pounding the opposing hurlers. In the ninth frame the locals made one more when Barham hit the ball over the left field fence. Barham's hip-pocket catch in the eighth inning was a feature of the game. 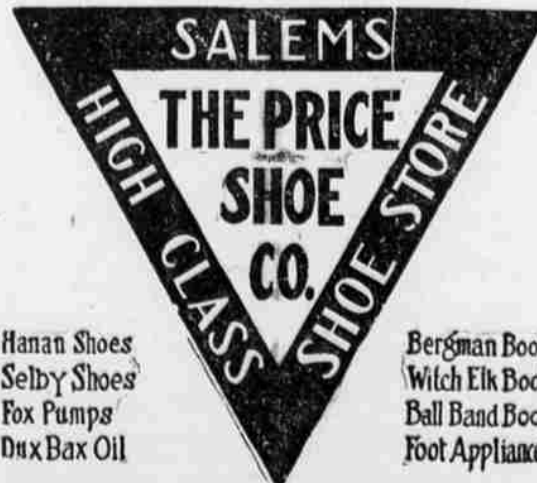
