DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOL FUND IS HELD UNJUST

Dissatisfaction with the financial relationship between the Salem school district and Marion county was expressed by members of the Salem school board at their meeting last night. Tullion paid the Salem district, amounting to over \$30,000 a year, is not received until after actual instruction for which the tuition is paid, he finished, they stated. The local district is forced to advance the money for the instruction of out-of-town pupils, while the out-of-town districts keep their money and put it out at interest.

Opinion was expressed that some arrangement should be made for receiving money in the fall, when needed and when placed in the hands of county district clerks. Early next month the local district will receive payment of tuition for out-of-town pupils given instruction during the past school year.

MODOC NORTHERN TO BE BUILT TO CORNELL

Portland, June 23.—The extension which the Southern Pacific through its subsidiary, the Central Pacific, is seeking to build to Cornell from Klamath is the line known as the Modoc Northern.

Cornell, 40 miles southeast from Klamath Falls is the point in north California to which Ralph Budd, president of the Great Northern railroad company said while in Portland Saturday, the Great Northern and Northern Pacific's Oregon Trunk railway, is projected from Bend via Klamath Falls to a San Francisco connection.

PRESIDENT AND PARTY ARRIVE IN SUMMER CAPITAL

Swampscott, Mass., June 24.—(By Associated Press)—President and Mrs. Coolidge arrived here today for a vacation that is expected to continue through the summer. The special train on which the presidential party traveled from Washington arrived at Salem at 8 o'clock this morning. The president motored to Swampscott for breakfast at the home of his friend Frank W. Stearns, who was among those who greeted him at the Salem station.

It is probable that Mr. and Mrs. Coolidge will spend a day or two as guests of Mr. and Mrs. Stearns before taking over Whitecourt, the spacious cottage by the sea that will be the summer White House.

President Coolidge does not expect to return to Washington until late in August or early in September, and then not until after he has paid a brief visit to his father's home in Plymouth, Vt.

While the president will be able during the summer to keep in touch with affairs of government, through Secretary Sanders and an office force that will have headquarters in Linn and will be in direct wire communication with Washington, it is arranged that he will give himself over mainly to rest and recreation. The Mayflower is at anchor at Marblehead within sight of Whitecourt and it is probable that, in addition to short cruises on the yacht, Mr. and Mrs. Coolidge will take frequent motor trips to nearby points along the shore.
